[Persons Confirmed at Notre-Dame de Québec 24 August 1664 (sic)]

Transcriber's notes: These confirmations are found on FHL film #1311432, item #14 and also on the indicated PRDH Online certificates. The names are transcribed as found on the film and have not been "modernized", as they are on PRDH Online. Names followed by an asterisk [*] are not shown in the *Dictionnaire Jetté [DJ]* as having been confirmed. A double asterisk [**] indicates the name could not be found in *DJ*. Family names in parentheses are as shown in *DJ*. Ages are given as shown on the film. Transcriber's comments are in brackets. References are listed at the end of the lists. The date of this list on PRDH Online is 24 August 1665. *DJ* shows the date as 24 August 1664. This list is found on the film after the 25 July 1665 list at *Notre-Dame de Québec* and before the 31 August 1665 list at *Notre-Dame de Québec*. [It is also confirmed by Marcel Trudel in *La Population du Canada en 1666, Recensement Reconstitué*, p. 65, that the date of this particular list was indeed 24 August 1665. The first person's name on the list was that of the son of Colonel Chastelar de Salière.] The names of some newly-arrived soldiers in the Carignan-Salière Regiment will be indicated in the lists that follow. Their names are found in Michel Langlois's book, *Carignan-Salière 1665-1668 [CS]*. For some of these men, Langlois is able to give the name of the ship they arrived on; date of arrival; company commander. For others, because of their confirmation and, in some cases, being received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire*, he feels they were most likely soldiers in the Carignan-Salière Regiment.

M^r. François de Salieres**, 15 years [Son of Henri de Chastelard de Salières. Was the godfather of François LeMoyné, son of Charles LeMoyné and Catherine Primot, on 10 March 1666 in Montréal and on 2 May 1666 in Montréal was the godfather of Françoise, daughter of Jean Milot dit Lebourguignon and Mathurine Thibaud (**PRDH** #39825, 39841). The *soldat* François Chastelard attended the marriage of Jean-Baptiste Migeon de Branssat and Catherine Gauchet on 26 November 1665 at Montréal (*CS*, p. 75; **PRDH** #47288 under the name of *DeChapelas*).]

Nicolas Maurissec**, 30 [Nicolas *Maurisset* shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 408).]

Jean du Tertre, 24 [Dutartre dit Desrosiers shown as confirmed on this date (*DJ*, p. 397). Jean Du Tertre was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 23 August 1665; Jean Dutertre dit Desmarais was shown as a soldier in the Company of Lamotte in 1670 (*CS*, pp. 505, 321).]

Julien allart, 23 [There are two possibilities for this name. The underlined name is the one shown in *DJ* as having been confirmed. Julien Allard dit Lavergne; Julien Allard dit Labarre. *CS* (p. 505) says Julien *Alart* was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665. Julien Allard dit Lavergne was an *engagé* in 1665 whereas Julien Allard dit Labarre arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix* with the company of Saurel. The latter married, had children and may have left descendants (*CS*, pp. 203-204). Both men died in Québec (*DJ*, p. 9).]

Jacques Berthé, 30 (*Berté dit Champagne*) [He was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665 (*CS*, p. 505). Jacques *Bertet dit Champagne* arrived on board the *Aigle d'or* on 18 August 1665 in the company of Captain Contrecoeur (*CS*, p. 228). On 29 March 1679, at Québec, Jacques Berthet Champagne was godfather to Jeanne Elisabeth Leroy, daughter of Simon Leroy and Claude Deschalets. On 30 June 1679, at L'Ange-Gardien, he was said to be the father of twins, Jacques and Charles, born on the 14th of June. The mother was Charlotte.... It is not known what happened to his two sons. Jacques was buried on 10 January 1693 in Québec. (**PRDH** #59817, #11166).]

Philippe n., 20 [No family name was given.] [He was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665 and was listed as a soldier (*CS*, pp. 436, 505).]

Pierre Payé*, 23 (*Payet dit Saint-Amour*) [He was a corporal in the company of Captain Lamotte; arrived on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or* in the Company of Captain Latour. He married and left descendants (*CS*, p. 151, 427, 428).]

- Guillaume Richard****, 26 [There are two Guillaume Richards: one who was confirmed and received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665; the other who was received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 25 September 1665. The first one is listed as a soldier; the second one (Guillaume Richard *dit* Lafleur) arrived on 12 September 1665 on board the *Saint-Sébastien* in the company of Captain LaVarenne (CS, pp. 505, 509, 452).]
- Raymond Dubaut****, 20 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 302).]
- Nicolas Dumoy****, 20 [Received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665; Nicolas Dumay shown as a soldier (CS, pp. 315, 505). On 24 May 1675, at Sorel, Nicolas Dumoy Boishulin was the godfather of Nicole Drouet, daughter of Mathurin and Marie Bardou (PRDH #83163).]
- Anthoine Gargout****, 30 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 343).]
- Jean Dupray****, 21 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 317).]
- Charles Dubois**, 23 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 302).]
- Bernard florensan***, 30 (Florensac (de) *dit* LeGascon) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix*, a soldier in the company of Captain Contrecoeur; received *le scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 24 August 1665 (CS, p. 329).]
- Charles Friard****, 12 [*Friand* on PRDH #403691]
- François fortunay Rüette***, 9 years (François-Madeleine-Fortuné Ruette, sieur D'Auteuil)
- Jean Racapé****, 26 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 446).]
[Above names, PRDH # 403691]
- Jean DuGüeil**, 27 (Delguel *dit* Labrèche) [DJ (p. 321) shows him as being confirmed on 24 August 1664. Arrived as an *adjoind au garde-magasin* in the Carignan - Salière Regiment; married and left descendants (CS, p. 292).]
- Jean LeVasseur****, 28 [Shown as a soldier; a Jean Levasseur received *le scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 20 September 1665 (CS, p. 397).]
- Jean Gaudelle****, 27 [Jean *Gardelle* was shown as a soldier (CS, p. 343).]
- Michel Croillé****, 17 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 285).]
- François Taillant****, 32 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 477).]
- Matthieu Binet**, 18 (Binet *dit* Lespérance) [Arrived on 17 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or*, a soldier in the company of Captain Lafredièrre. Married, had children, but it is not known if they left descendants (CS, p. 232; PRDH #3436).]
- Jean ficher****, 40 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 329).]
- Louys delaCour****, 25 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 291).]
- Michel Maçon****, 35 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 400).]
- Luc leDoux****, 19 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 388).] [Was still in Québec on 10 September 1666 when he was a witness to the wedding of Étienne Blanchon and Anne Convent, widow of Jacques Maheu (PRDH #66709).]
- Hugues Randin***, 19 [*Jacques* on PRDH, #403692] [Hugues Randin arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix*, an *enseigne* in the company of Captain Saurel. (CS, p. 447).]
- Pierre Thauré****, 20 [Shown as soldier (CS, p. 480).]
- René Le Mousnier****, 30 [Shown as soldier (CS, p. 392).]
- Anthoine leblanc**, 20 (Leblanc *dit* Jolicoeur) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix* as a soldier in the company of Captain Maximy. Married and left descendants (CS, pp. 386, 387).]
- François Lauzide****, 20 [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or* as a *cadet* in the company of Colonel de Salière (CS, p. 385).]
- Philippes dufaux****, 26 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 308).]
- Jean Lefort****, 20 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 389).]
[Above names, PRDH #403692.]
- Jacques Lormier****, 27 [Shown as a soldier (CS, p. 398).]

Nicolas Chouquet, 20 (Choquet *dit* Champagne) [Received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 26 August 1665; was *le nommé* (the man named) *Champagne* in the company of Colonel de Salière who arrived on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or*; married and left descendants (*CS*, pp. 278, 505).]

Anthoine forestier*, 22 [Arrived as *chirurgien* (surgeon) on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or* in the company of Captain La Motte (*CS*, p. 336). Father of Marguerite, married to **Jean-Baptiste Bissot, sieur de Vincennes**, who was in Détroit as early as 1704 (*DJ*, p. 427; *MPHC*, Vol. 33, p. 232).]

Martial Guautier**, 22

Jean Gardet**, 15 [Gardel on **PRDH**, #403693.] [Shown as soldier (*CS*, p. 343).]

Jean Baptiste, N, 18 years old [No last name given.] [Shown as soldier (*CS*, p. 367).]

Anthoinet Voisinet**, 20 [Shown as soldier (*CS*, p. 496).]

Raymond Boynaud, 22 (Boineau *dit* La Chaume) [Raymond *Boineau dit La Chaume* was confirmed on 24 August 1664 at Québec (*DJ*, p. 120). Raymond Boineau *dit* La Chaume arrived on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or* as a soldier in the company of Captain Lafredière; was confirmed on 24 August 1665; received *le scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on the same day. Married and left descendants. (*CS*, pp. 234, 505).] [Note: His demise was unusual. See *CS*, p. 234.]

Francois Demay**, 25 [Shown as soldier (*CS*, p. 294).]

Pierre Marcansin**, 35 [Shown as soldier (*CS*, p. 403).]

Vincent Boysard**, 20

Gilles Couthurier, 24 (Couturier *dit* Labonté) [*Cousturier* on **PRDH** #403694.] [*Labonté* arrived on board the *Paix* on 19 August 1665 as a soldier in the company of Captain Saurel and received *le scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 26 August 1665. Married and left descendants (*CS*, pp. 285, 506).]

Francois Vionnet**, 30 [Shown as soldier (*CS*, p. 496).]

Jacques Reveillé**, 24 [Shown as soldier (*CS*, 452).]

Francois Perard, 22 (Pérard) [François *Peraud* shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 432).]

Jean Herpin, 22 (Herpin *dit* Tourangeau) [Arrived in Québec in August 1665. Married but left no descendants (*CS*, p. 362).]

Jean Baptiste Lavanois*, 35 (Lavanois *dit* Laviolette) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix* as a soldier in the company of Captain Saurel. Received *le Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 24 August 1665; married but left no descendants (*CS*, pp. 385, 506).]

François de Chavigny*, 15 (Chavigny (de), *sieur de Chevroti* (Chavigny (de), *sieur de Chevrotière*) [Received *le Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 24 August 1665 (*CS*, p. 505).][See *L'Ancêtre*, No. 274, vol. 32, printemps 2006, pp. 231- 232 for more information on him and the Chavigny family.]

Joseph Denys, 21 (Denis *dit* le Vallon) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix* as a soldier in the company of Captain Contrecoeur (*CS*, pp. 295, 505).]

René Bernier**, 18 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 227).]

Jean Doussier**, 40 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 302).]

Anthoine de Nossets**, 27 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 296).]

[Above names, **PRDH** #403694.]

Claude Roüier**, 43 [Claude Rouy(er) *dit* La Mulle et La Teille, a corporal of Salière arrived on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or*. On 23 November 1667, at Montréal, he witnessed the marriage contract, by Basset, of Bernard Delpesches and Marguerite Jourdain; he attended their wedding two days later at Notre-Dame de Montréal (*CS*, p. 457).]

Jean André**, 18 [Shown as a soldier; received *le Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 24 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 208,505).]

Anthoine Hermet**, 30 [*Germet* on **PRDH** #403695.] [Shown as a soldier and received *le Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 24 August 1665 under the name of *Vermet* (*CS*, pp. 359, 505).]
Nicolas Maistre**, 19 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 402).]
Pasquier Marchant**, 2 [Shown as a soldier and received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 403, 505).]
Leonor Estourneau**, 21 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 324).]
Pierre Bonnet**, 29 [Shown as a soldier; received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 238, 505).]
Pierre Barbier**, 20
Pierre Renaud, 25 (Renaud / Renault *dit* Locot / Locas) [Arrived on 18 August on board the *Aigle d'or* as a soldier in the company of Captain Grandfontaine; received *le Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 24 August 1665; married and left descendants (*CS*, pp. 451, 505).]
Pierre Cheneviér**, 40 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 276).]
Marin Brunet**, 18 [*Marian* Brunet shown as a soldier; received into the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 24 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 250, 505).]
Mathurin Herdoüet**, 22 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 359).]
Julien Dumont, 18 (Dumont *dit* Lafleur) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix* as a soldier in the Company of Captain Maximy; married and left descendants (*CS*, pp. 315, 316).]
René Berton**, 20 (Breton) [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 230).] [On the confirmation list **PRDH** has the name *Berton*. However, when this name is put into **PRDH** it changes to *Breton*. René *Breton* married Charlotte de Chavigny on 6 November 1668 at Québec (*DJ* (p. 168) shows him as being confirmed on 24 August 1664). Both René and Charlotte appear to have died outside of Québec. Even though Charlotte remarried on 2 September 1709 at Québec, it appears that after 1713 she and her second husband, Jean Giron, left Québec. Based on the will of her mother, Eléonore de Grandmaison, it appears that Charlotte and her first husband, René Breton, had at least one child named Mathieu (**PRDH** #66822, #11328, #11424, #36917).]

Jacques Bitet, 21 (Bidet *dit* Desroussels) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix* as a soldier in the company of Captain Maximy; married and left descendants (*CS*, pp. 231, 232).]
Sylvain Poussé**, 20 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 443).]
André Robert**, 22 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 454).]

Jean Robin, 22 (Robin *dit* Lapointe) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the **Paix** as a soldier in the company of Captain Saurel. Married and left descendants (*CS*, p. 454).]

Anthoine Rausseau, 20 (Rousseau *dit* Labonté) [Arrived on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or* as a soldier in the company of Captain Lafrediére. Married and left descendants (*CS*, p. 455).] [Father of Marie-Marguerite who married **Julien Piédalue dit Lapairie / Prairie** who was hired, in a contract by Adhémar, to go to *Détroit* on 18 August 1710.]

Nicolas Persé**, 25 [Nicolas *Percé (Pérée)* shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 432).]

Pierre Guifunt, 20 [*DJ*, p. 540, indicates he might be *Louis Guiffon* who was age 50 in the 1681 census in the lower town of Québec.] [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 354).]

Gabriel Gibaud, 22 (Gibault *dit* Poitevin) [Arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the **Paix** as a soldier in the company of Captain Saurel; received *le Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 26 August 1665; married and left descendants (*CS*, pp. 351, 506).]

Pierre Batüel**, 22 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 219).]

Vincent Paisonaux**, 22 [*Poissonaux* on **PRDH** #403697.] [Vincent *Paisonaux* shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 424). [The name *Poissonaux* is linked to *Boissoneau* on **PRDH**. According to *DJ*, Vincent Boissoneau *dit* Saint-Onge arrived in September 1665 in the company of Maximy in the Carignan Regiment (*DJ*, p. 122). According to Langlois, Vincent Boissoneau *dit Saintonge* arrived on 19 August 1665 in the company of Maximy on board the **Paix**. Langlois does not link him to Vincent *Paisonaux* who was confirmed on the 24th of August 1665. Vincent Boissoneau married and left descendants (*CS*, p. 235).]

"The Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (also known as the brown scapular), is by far the best known, most celebrated, and most widespread of the small scapulars." The small scapular "should consist of two segments of brown woolen cloth; black, however is also admissible. This scapular usually bears on one side the image of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, but neither this nor any other image is prescribed." Our Lady, appearing to Simon Stock at Cambridge, England, on Sunday, 16 July, 1251, promised: "Take, beloved son, this scapular of thy order as a badge of my confraternity and for thee and all Carmelites a special sign of grace: whoever dies in this garment [or wearing the small scapular], will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, a pledge of peace and of the covenant." It is understandable, then, that soldiers about to set out for battle against the Iroquois would want the blessings of the sacramental scapular's protection. See

- Paul Vignaud**, 20 (*Vignault dit Laverdure*) [He arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix* as a soldier in the company of Captain Maximy; was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 31 August 1665; married Françoise Bourgeois on 3 November 1669 at Ste-Famille, l'Île d'Orléans and left descendants (*CS*, pp. 184, 494, 506).][*DJ*, p. 1127, says Vignault arrived in September 1665.]
- Jean Gazail**, 26 (*Gazaille dit Saint-Germain*) [He arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix*, a corporal in the company of Captain Contrecoeur; was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 31 August 1665; married Jeanne Touzé on 8 October 1668 in Québec and left descendants. (*CS*, pp. 168, 347, 506).]
- Pierre Brunet****, 20 [He arrived on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or* in the company of Captain Lamotte; was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 31 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 250, 506).]
- Francois Vercherat****, 26 [Received the *Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 30 August 1665 (*CS*, p. 506).] [Was still present in Québec City on 10 March 1669 when he was the witness at two weddings: (1) Jean Herpin and Madeleine Vallée; (2) Nicolas *Preunier* and Antoinette Legrand (**PRDH** #66854, #66855). Both Jean-François Herpin *dit* Tourangeau and Nicolas Prunier *dit* Lepicart had been soldiers in the Carignan-Salière Regiment (*CS*, pp. 360, 445).]
- Claude Duarda****, 20 [Shown as a soldier; Claude *Du Hasdat* received the *Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 31 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 302, 506).]
- Nicolas Delachaume**, 25 (*Guillaud, sieur de LaChaume*) [Shown as a soldier; received the *Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 30 August 1665. Langlois also has Nicolas Guillaud *dit* Lachaume but does not link him with Nicolas Delachaume. Nicolas Guillaud arrived on 19 August 1665 on board the *Paix*, as a soldier in the company of Capitaine Contrecoeur (*CS*, pp. 290, 354, 506).] [Married Marie-Madeleine Routy on 22 October 1668 in Québec; one son who married. It is possible that this family returned to France. Langlois indicates the family is not mentioned in *Nouvelle-France* after 1669 and PRDH shows a marriage for the son, with no place or date given (**PRDH** #66813, #32586, #30258, #30445, #30444).]
- Jean Guillaumet****, 35 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 355).]
- Ollivier Sozet****, 26 [Shown as a soldier; was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 31 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 474, 506).]
- Jean Boursier****, 20 [Received the *Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 26 August 1665 (*CS*, p. 506).] [Possibly Jean Boursier *dit* Lavigne who married Marie-Marthe Thibodeau on 9 April 1673 in Montréal; left descendants (*DJ*, p. 155; **PRDH** #10659).]

- Jean delaCroix****, 22 [Shown as a soldier; was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 31 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 291, 507).][Possibly the same Jean *Delacrois*, a carpenter, who was the godfather of Marie Leroy, daughter of Simon Leroy and Claude Dechales on 2 May 1681 in Montréal; a Jean *Lacroix* was buried on 26 December 1728 at St-Laurent, with the note that he had been married before 24 March 1708 in France to Jeanne Rancin (**PRDH** #46237, #40600).]
- Jean Renoïard****, 20 [He arrived on 18 August 1665, on board the *Aigle d'or* as a soldier in the company of Captain Lafredière; abjured Calvinism at *l'hôpital de Québec* on 26 August 1665; was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 31 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 452, 507).]
- Jacques Berard**, 45 [Shown as a soldier (*CS*, p. 226).] [In 1666 census at the Jesuits at Notre-Dame des Anges near Québec (*DJ*, p. 84).]
- Pierre Bergeron****, 18 [Shown as a soldier; was in the *Confrérie de la Scapulaire* on 31 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 226, 507).]

Robert Pepin, 26 [In *Nouvelle-France* by 1 December 1662, when he attended the marriage at Château-Richer of his sister-in-law, Catherine Crampon (widow of his brother Louis), to Pierre Voyer. Robert married Marie Crête on 4 November 1670 at Québec and left descendants (*DJ*, pp. 893, 1132).]

Pierre Boutaut, 32 (Bouteau *dit* Laramée) [Arrived on 18 August 1665 on board the *Aigle d'or* as a soldier in the company of Colonel de Salière; received the *Scapulaire du Mont-Carmel* on 31 August 1665 (*CS*, pp. 243, 506).][*Habitant* of Montréal in 1681 census (*DJ*, p. 156).]

M.^{re} Antoine Contrecoeur, 60 (Pécaudy, *sieur de* Contrecoeur) [Arrived on board the *Paix* on 19 August 1665 as a captain under Salière; married Barbe Denis on 17 September 1667 at Québec and left descendants (*CS*, pp.168, 428-431; *DJ*, p. 886).]
