

Confirmations in Boucherville, 20 May 1676

Transcriber's notes: These confirmations are found on FHL film #1311432, item #14, and also on the indicated PRDH Online certificates. The names are transcribed as found on the film and have not been standardized, as they are on PRDH Online. Names followed by an asterisk [*] are not shown in the *Dictionnaire Jetté [DJ]* as having been confirmed. [Note from Suzanne Sommerville - Jetté may have omitted recording some confirmations because he used these references, sometimes, to establish the first presence of an individual in New France. If a person was documented before the confirmation took place, he used the earlier date.] A double asterisk [**] indicates the name could not be found in *DJ*. Family names in parentheses are as shown in *DJ*. Transcriber's comments are in brackets. If an individual was related to or the ancestor of a person who was in Détroit between 1701 and 1710, that information is also given. References are cited at the end of the lists.

Pierre Aviroux * (Abirou *dit* Larose) [In the Company of Captain Laubia, Pierre *Aberou dit* Larose arrived in Québec, 14 September 1665, on board *la Justice*. He married Marie Anne Despernay, 29 April 1675, Pointe-aux-Trembles (Langlois, 202; *DJ*, 1).]

Marguerite Colet * (Collet) [Marguerite Collet's brother, **Pierre Collet**, was hired to go to Détroit 15 June 1706 and 20 May 1708 (*DJ*, 265; RAPQ, 210, 212).]

Adrien Senecal * (Sénécal) [Husband of Jeanne Lecomte, below. Parents of **Adrien Sénécal** who was hired to go to Détroit 10 July 1703, 28 July 1704, 30 May 1705 and 7 October 1706 (*DJ*, 1043; RAPQ, 208, 209, 210, 211).]

Jeanne le Conte * (Lecomte)

Noelle Tiremont * [Noëlle Tiremont married Bernard Bertin *dit* Languedoc, 23 September 1670, Québec (*DJ*, 94).]

Denise Beauchamp * [Sister of **Pierre Beauchamp** who was hired to go to Détroit 30 May 1705, 5 June 1707, 9 March 1709 (*DJ*, 60; RAPQ, 210, 211, 212) and **Jacques Beauchamp** who was hired to go to Détroit 30 May 1705 and 9 March 1709 (RAPQ 210, 212).]

Pierre Boisseau *

Francoise Boivin [*sic*] [Françoise Boivin married Louis Lamoureux about 1668 in Longueuil (*DJ*, 640).]

Catherine Beauchamp * [Sister of the above Denise, Pierre and Jacques Beauchamp. She married Pierre Hunault *dit* Deschamps 4 December 1686, Pointe-aux-Trembles (*DJ*, 580); their son, **Pierre Hunault**, was hired, 12 April 1710, by François Chesne to go to Détroit (*DJ*, 60, 580; RAPQ, 212).]

Claude Jodouin * (Jodoin)

Maurice Menard * (Ménard) [Maurice Ménard married Madeline Couc *circa* 1692 at Michillimakinac. He was the brother-in-law of **Isabelle Couc** who was in Détroit in 1704 and 1706 (*DJ*, 278, 795, Ste. Anne du Détroit, images 6, 8); brother-in-law of **Marguerite Couc**, who married Jean Fafard *dit* Maconce and **Michel Massé**, who were in Détroit 9 October 1707, 7 June 1710 (*DJ*, 410, 785; RAPQ, 211; Ste Anne du Détroit, image 12; MPHC, 33, 373, 375,479; MPHC, 34, 264, 265); and Marie Angélique Couc, who married François Delpé *dit* Saint-Cerny. Their son, **Louis Delpé dit Saint-Cerny**, was in Détroit 7 June 1710, when he was one of the habitants who agreed to pay for a priest, and 3 July 1710 when he purchased property from Michel Massé (*DJ*, 323; MPHC, 33, 479; MPHC, 34, 264). It is possible that Maurice Ménard passed through Détroit on one of his voyages to and from Michilimackinac; however, proof that he was in Détroit has not been found to date.]

His brother, Michel (Étienne *dit*) Philippe, married Marie Ouacanteoua (commonly known as Rouensa), *circa* 1703 in Kaskaskia (*DJ*, 408).]

Confirmations in Montréal, 25 May 1676 and 31 May 1676

Transcriber's notes: These confirmations are found in two sources: FHL [Family History Library] film #0375840, Notre-Dame-de-Montréal, and FHL film #1311432, item #14 [Archdiocese of Québec]. The latter source combines, without distinction, the two confirmation lists. PRDH has two lists: the combined list, for 25 May 1676 and for 31 May 1676, and a separate list for 31 May 1676. If there is a difference in the spelling of the name from either “original” source, both spellings are given, the first one from the Notre-Dame-de-Montréal list. The names are transcribed as found on the film and have not been standardized, as they are on PRDH Online. Names followed by an asterisk [*] are not shown in the *Dictionnaire Jetté [DJ]* as having been confirmed. [Note from Suzanne Sommerville - Jetté may have omitted recording some confirmations because he used these references, sometimes, to establish the first presence of an individual in New France. If a person was documented before the confirmation took place, he used the earlier date.] A double asterisk [**] indicates the name could not be found in *DJ*. Family names in parentheses are as shown in *DJ*. Transcriber's comments are in brackets. If an individual was related to or the ancestor of a person who was in Détroit between 1701 and 1710, that information is also given. References are cited at the end of the lists. The following list is an excellent example of the intricacies of family life at that time.

Pierre duCharne* 12 ½ [*sic*] [Duchaune, age 11, on PRDH] [Ducharme/Ducharne] [Buried 7 June 1691, Montréal, killed by the Iroquois (*DJ*, 373).]

Urbain Tessier* 14 [Not on the list from Notre-Dame-de-Montréal but on the Archdiocese list.]

Urbain bouvier* 10-½ [*sic*]

Michel Lair* 12 [Lert on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Lair or Lert]

Joseph Aubuchon* 12 [Son of Jean Aubuchon *dit* Lespérance and Marguerite Sédilot, Joseph Aubuchon was the brother of **Gabriel Aubuchon** who was in the first convoy to Détroit. (*DJ*, 28; RAPQ, 206).]

Jean Chaperon* 8 [Chapron on PRDH and Archdiocese list]

Robert Janot* 14 [Jeannot on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Janot *dit* Lachapelle] [**Robert Janot** was at Fort Pontchartrain with **Pierre Bazinet** on 22 May 1708 when **Joseph Bazinet**, in Montréal, said he was acting on their behalf as their associate. They owed Pierre Chartier, a Montréal merchant, money for their equipment for the *voyage* (*DJ*, 591; MNR, Vol. II, 484, 485, 486).]

Jean Baudry* 10 [Beaudry or Baudry *dit* l'ÉpINETTE]

Michel Charbonneau* 10 [**Michel Charbonneau**, his brother, **Joseph**, and **Jean Baptiste Cusson** owed money to Pierre You, *sieur de* Ladécouverte, for their *voyage to Détroit du lac Érié*, 11 April 1707, contract by the notary Adhémar. Michel Charbonneau married Marguerite Denoyon, 12 November 1692 in Boucherville. She was the sister of **Jacques** and **François Denoyon** who were hired to go to Détroit 28 July 1704 (*DJ*, 226, 335; RAPQ, 209; MNR, Vol. II, 431, 432).]

Andre du Mets* 16 [Demers or Dumets]

Anthoine Mastha* [no age given] [Masta] [Age 10 on PRDH and Archdiocese list]

Jean Roy* 15 [Roy or Leroy]

Pierre papin* 9 [Died October 1690, Pointe-aux-Trembles, killed by the English (*DJ*, 867).]

Michel Boivin* 9 [Boutin on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Boivin *dit* Panse] [There was no Michel Boutin in either PRDH or *DJ*.]

Pierre Chauvin* 12 [Buried 7 June 1691, Montréal, killed by the Iroquois (*DJ*, 242).]

Pierre Maguet 12 [His mother, Françoise Goubilleau, married Paul Dazé, 15 April 1671, Montréal. Their son **Paul Charles Dazé**, and Pierre Maguet's half-brother, was hired to go to Détroit in the first convoy (24 July 1701 and 16 July 1702 (*DJ*, 314, 752; RAPQ, 205, 206).)]

Louis Hubert* 13 [Hubert *dit* Lacroix] [On 23 April 1709, in a contract by Adhémar, **Louis Hubert dit Lacroix**, his brother, **Ignace Hubert**, and **Charles Cusson** agreed they owed the merchant Jean Baptiste Neveu the sum of 1955 *livres*, 8 *sols* and 8 *deniers du pays*, for the equipment of the voyage they were going to make to *fort le Pontchartrain du lac Érié* (*DJ*, 575; *MNR*, Vol. II, 521, 522).]

Charles duMets* 9 [Dumetre on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Demers/Dumets]

[At this point the Notre-Dame-de-Montréal confirmation lists stops with the number 58 (males) written. The list from FHL microfilm #1311432, item #14, continues as does the list from PRDH which appears to incorporate the 31 May 1676 confirmation list under PRDH act #403625, act #403626, act #403627.]

25 May 1676- Females –Notre-Dame-de-Montréal

Jeanne Brossart* 13 [Even though this is the beginning of the female confirmations and the name is clearly written Jeanne on the Notre-Dame-de-Montréal list, both the Archdiocese of Québec version and PRDH use the name Jean.] [Brossard] [Jeanne Brossard, daughter of Urbain Brossard and Urbaine Hodiau, married Henri Catin, 20 November 1679, Montréal. Their daughter, **Jeanne Cécile Catin**, married **Jacques Campeau**, 1 December 1699, Montréal; they were in Détroit, 6 December 1708 when their daughter, **Marie Angélique Campeau**, was born (*DJ*, 175, 195, 208).]

Catherine Chamillan 20 [Sommillard on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Soumillard] [Catherine Soumillard was a niece of Marguerite Bourgeoys and took her vows in the order of the Congrégation de Notre-Dame (hereafter C. N. D.) under the name *soeur de la Purification* (*DJ*, 1056).]

Marie Charlotte Millet* 14 [Marie Charlotte Millet, daughter of Nicolas Millet and Catherine Lorion, was the half-sister of **Pierre Desautels** and **Gilbert Desautels**. In her fourth marriage, her mother, Catherine Lorion, married Pierre Desautels *dit* Lapointe, 23 November 1676, Montréal. Their son, **Pierre Desautels**, was hired to go to Détroit in the first convoy, 10 July 1703, 28 July 1704. Their second son, **Gilbert Desautels**, was hired to go to Détroit 30 May 1705 and 13 April 1707 (*DJ*, 337, 338, 814; *RAPQ*, 206, 208, 209, 210, 211).]

Marguerite picart* 11 [age 21 on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Picard] [Marguerite Picard was baptized 16 February 1667, Montréal. Thus, she was nine years old in May 1676 (*DJ*, 911).]

Catherine Lozon* 10 [Losen on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Lauzon/Lauson]

Louise Jeanne Bailly* 12 [Louise Jeanne Bailly, daughter of François Bailly *dit* Lafleur and Marie Fonteneau, married **Pierre Chesne dit Saint-Onge**, 29 November 1676, Montréal. They were the parents of seven children, four of whom were involved in the beginning of Détroit: **François**, Marie, Charles and Pierre (*DJ*, 41, 42, 245). (See Gail Moreau-DesHarnais, Diane Wolford Sheppard, "Pierre Chesne *dit* Saint-Onge: Part I," *MHH*, Vol. 33, #3, July 2012, 160-169).]

Marie Valliquet* 14 [Valiquet]

Marie Chaperon* 13

Marie Therese hunaut* 13 [Hunault] [Marie Thérèse Hunault, daughter of Toussaint Hunault *dit* Deschamps and Marie Lorgueuil, married Guillaume Leclerc, 24 November 1676, Montréal. She was "*tuée cruellement dans la grange*" par les Iroquois (killed cruelly in the barn by the Iroquois), 17 August 1689. Her brother, **Pierre Hunault** was hired by **François Chesne** to go to Détroit 12 April 1710 (*DJ*, 580, 675; *RAPQ*, 212).]

Marie Therese Mompellier* 21 [Mompellier on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Martin *dite* Montpellier] [Marie Thérèse Martin *dite* Montpellier, daughter of Antoine Martin *dit* Montpellier and Denise Sevestre, married Mathurin Langevin, 9 October 1674, Québec. In a second marriage, her mother, Denise Sevestre, married Philippe Neveu. They were the parents of Jacques Neveu who married Michelle Chauvin, 24 October 1695,

Montréal. Michelle Chauvin and three of her children were killed by the *Amérindiens* [modern French word for *sauvages* / Indians, used when the specific nation is unknown], 22 June 1722, near Kaskaskia (*DJ*, 644, 778, 847).]

Jeanne Goguet* 15 [Wife of Noël Sommereux, 15 October 1674, Montréal (*DJ*, 1054).]

Catherine Archambaud* 12-½ [*sic*] [Archambaut on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Archambault]

Jeanne de Belestre* 9 [Picote on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Picoté de Belestre] [Geneviève Jeanne Picoté, daughter of Pierre Picoté, *sieur de Belestre*, and Marie Par, was the sister of **Marie Anne Picoté** who married **Alphonse Tonty**, 17 February 1689, Montréal, and the sister of **François Marie Picoté** who brought **Mesdames Tonty** and **Cadillac** to Détroit in the fall of 1701. Geneviève Jeanne Picoté was the mother of a daughter, Jeanne Geneviève, baptized 21 June 1686, Montréal, fathered by Pierre LeMoine, *sieur d'Iberville* (*DJ*, 914, 915, 1083; RAPQ, 206).]

Jeanne Basset* 9 [on the Notre-Dame-de-Montréal list, the age appears to be 8-½]

Marie Petronille Philastreau* 12 [difficult to decipher on the Notre-Dame-de-Montréal list] [Filiatrault/Fillasteau] [Perrine Filiatrault, daughter of René Filiatrault and Jeanne Hérault, married Simon Daveau *dit* Boutentrain, *circa* 1677, in Lachine. She and her son Jean Baptiste Daveau were killed by the Iroquois 5 August 1689. Her husband was captured during the Lachine Massacre and presumed dead in captivity. She was the sister of **Jacques Filiatrault** who was hired to go to Détroit 30 May 1705 and 2 October 1710 (*DJ*, 311, 419; PRDH Individual #24368, PRDH Burial #14531, PRDH Family #4589; RAPQ, 210, 213; *Mémoires*, 211, 223, 225).]

Louise Pellerin* 12 [Pelerin on PRDH and Archdiocese list] [Charlotte Louise Pellerin *dite* Saint-Amand. Her sister, Jeanne Pellerin, was the first wife of **Bertrand Arnaud** who was in the first convoy to Détroit (*DJ*, 887; RAPQ, 206).]

Barbe Loisel* 13 [**Barbe Loisel**, daughter of Louis Loisel and Marguerite Charlot, was married three times: (1) Pierre Roussel, 26 October 1676, Montréal; (2) **François Legantier**, *sieur de LaVallée et de Rané*, 28 November 1689, Montréal; (3) **François Fafard dit Delorme**, 30 December 1713, Détroit (*DJ*, 410, 695, 740, 1014; RAPQ, 212).]

Catherine Charly* 10 [Catherine Charly *dite* Saint-Ange was a nun of the order of C.N.D. in Montréal under the name of *soeur de Saint-Ange* and then *soeur de Saint-Sacrement*, was a novice in 1679, took her vows 25 June 1698, mother superior from 1708 to 1711 and from 1717 to 1719. She was buried 26 January 1719 (*DJ*, 231).]

Anne Malet* 10 [Mallet/Malet] [Daughter of Pierre Mallet and Marie Anne Hardy, Anne Mallet married Louis Ducharme/Ducharme, 27 November 1681, Montréal. He was killed by the English in the Battle of Laprairie and buried in Montréal 11 August 1691. Anne Mallet was the sister of **Pierre Mallet** who was in Détroit with his wife, **Magdeleine Thunay dite Dufresne**, by 16 August 1706 when their son, **Antoine**, was baptized in Ste Anne du Détroit. She was also the sister of **René Mallet** who was hired 6 November 1707 with **Louis Hubert dit Lacroix** and **Jacques Godé** to go to Détroit. (*DJ*, 373, 758, 759; MNR, Vol. II, 462, 463).]

Marie Magd du Charme* 7-½ [*sic*] [Duchaume on PRDH, illegible on the Archdiocese list] [Marie Madeleine Ducharme/Ducharme]

Barbe Perrin* 10 [Barbe Perrin, daughter of Henri Perrin and Jeanne Merrin, married René Huguet, 16 October 1680, Lachine. René Huguet died 26 June 1691 at Lachine, killed by the Iroquois after going to get some wheat one half hour after sunrise. He and his family (wife, Barbe Perrin, children, André and Anne Françoise) were captured by the Iroquois in 1689. René Huguet returned in 1691; his wife returned in 1694; his son, André, died in captivity; his daughter, Anne Françoise was raised by the Iroquois. When Barbe Perrin returned in 1694, she brought with her her daughter, Anne, born in captivity in Onontagué and fathered by Pierre Lorrain. (*DJ*, 579, 900, 901; *Mémoires*, 215, 225).]

Marie Charly* 14 [Marie Charly *dite* Sainte-Ange was a novice in 1679 and became a *religieuse* in the order of C. N. D. in Montréal. She was buried 28 April 1683 (*DJ*, 231).]

Marie Brunet* 9 [Brunet *dite* Belhumeur] [Her sister, Élisabeth Brunet, married Robert Réaume, 22 September 1696, Montréal. **Robert Réaume** helped escort **Mesdames Tonty** and **Cadillac** to Détroit in the fall of 1701 (*DJ*, 180, 971; RAPQ, 206).]

Barbe Celle* 13 [Celle *dite* Duclos] [Daughter of Gabriel Celle *dit* Duclos and Barbe Poisson, Barbe Celle married twice: (1) Louis Charbonnier *dit* Lafleur, 25 November 1680, Montréal, and (2) Pierre Lamoureux *dit* Saint-Germain, 2 October 1684, Montréal. Their daughter, Barbe Cartier, married **Paul Charles Dazé**, 19 November 1696, Pointe-aux-Trembles. **Charles Dazé** was hired to go to Détroit in the first convoy and 16 July 1702. Their son, **Joseph Cartier dit Larose**, was hired to go to Détroit in the first convoy and 16 July 1702 (*DJ*, 117, 162, 205, 212, 213, 227, 408, 641; *RAPQ*, 205, 206, 207).]

Marie Genevieve Malet* 13 [Mallet/Malet] [Marie Geneviève Mallet was the sister of Anne Mallet, above (*DJ*, 758, 759).]

Marie Anne Benoît married (2) Jean Besset, 16 May 1695, Laprairie. She was buried 9 August 1697, Laprairie, killed by the Iroquois. Her brother, **François Benoît dit Livernois** was hired to go to Detroit in the first convoy as well as 10 July 1703. Her sister, Élisabeth Benoît, married François Bleau, 22 February 1672, Montréal. Her brothers, **Pierre** and **Jacques Beauchamp** were hired to go to Détroit 30 May 1705. **Pierre Beauchamp** was hired to go there 5 June 1707; both brothers were hired to go there 9 March 1709 (*DJ*, 60, 131, 477; *RAPQ*, 210, 211, 212; *MNR*, Vol. II, 410, 411).]

Anne Le Duc* /Leduc 10 [Daughter of Jean Leduc and Marie Soulinier, Anne Françoise Leduc became a *religieuse* of *Hôtel-Dieu de Montréal* as *soeur* Saint-Joseph; a novice in 1694, professed in 1696; mother superior from 9 July 1717 to 9 July 1720. Her brother, **Jean Leduc**, was hired 11 October 1710 to go to Détroit (*DJ*, 683; MNR, Vol. II, 602, 603).]

Catherine Guertin* 12 [Guertin] Daughter of Louis Guertin and Élisabeth Camus/Lecamus, Catherine Guertin married Pierre Caillonneau, 29 October 1681, Montréal. Pierre Caillonneau was buried 9 November 1687, Contrecoeur, killed by the Iroquois. Their daughter, Catherine Caillonneau, married **Pierre Morisseau**, 17 January 1704, Boucherville. **Pierre Morisseau** was hired to go to Détroit in the original convoy as well as on 16 July 1702, 28 July 1704 and 30 May 1705 (*DJ*, 193, 538, 838; RAPQ, 206, 207, 209, 210).]

Margueritte LeMoyne* 12 [Lemoine on PRDH act #403632] [Lemoine/Lemoynes] [Daughter of Jacques Lemoine and Mathurine Godé, Marguerite Lemoine was a *religieuse* C.N.D. Montréal, *sieur de Saint-Esprit* in

1698, novice 1680, professed 1682, Mother Superior 25 June 1698 to 1708, 1711-1717, 1719-1722, 1729-1732 (*DJ*, 711).]

Marie Cunegonde Masta* 9 [Her family name is not stated on PRDH Act #403632] [Daughter of Mathurin Masta and Antoinette or Catherine Éloy, Marie Cunegonde Masta married Jean Baptiste Demers, 25 February 1686, Pointe-aux-Trembles. Their daughter, **Marguerite Demers**, married **André Bombardier dit Labombarde or Passepartout**, a soldier, 12 June 1706, Montréal. They were in Détroit 18 July 1707 when their son, **Jean**, was born and then baptized in Ste Anne du Détroit (*DJ*, 125, 326,788).]
