William Henry Clapp was born 29 October 1879 in Montréal. He died 21 April 1954 in Oakland, California. Clapp was an Impressionist painter. He studied art in Montréal from 1900 to 1903 and in Paris from 1904 to 1908. He returned to Montréal in 1908 and lived there until 1915 when he left for Cuba. Clapp settled in Oakland, California, in 1917. You can read his biography in the Canadian Encyclopedia.¹

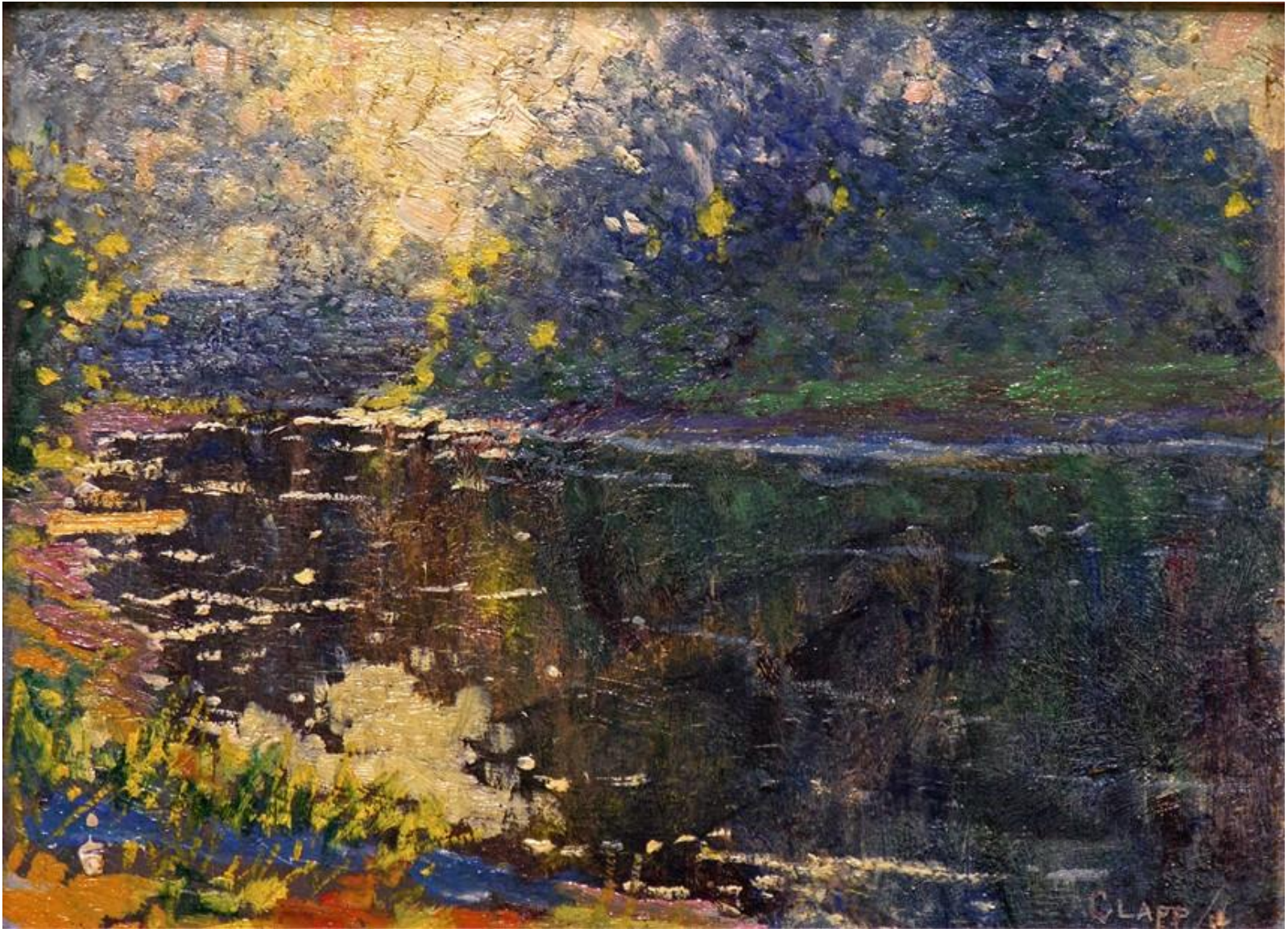

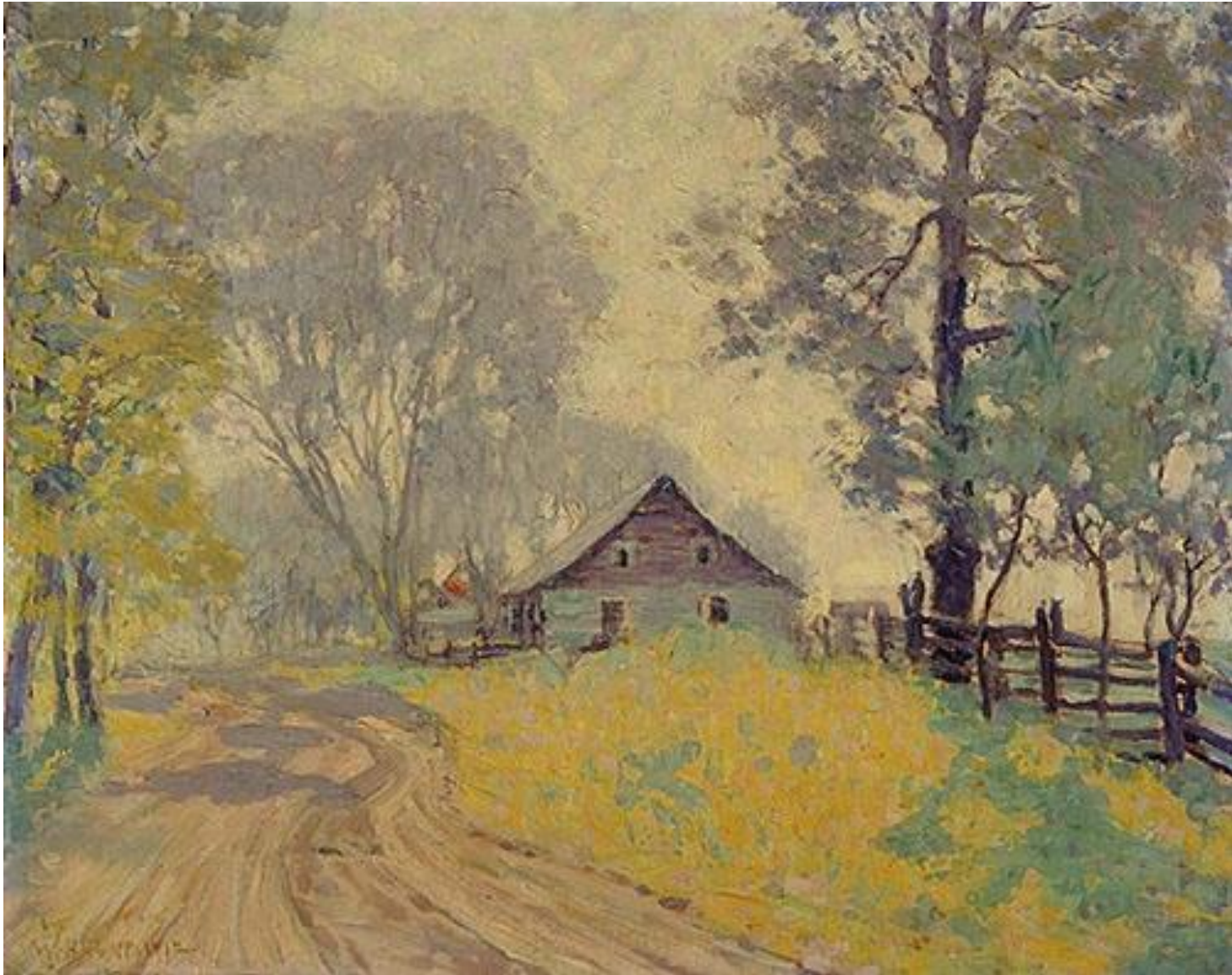
