

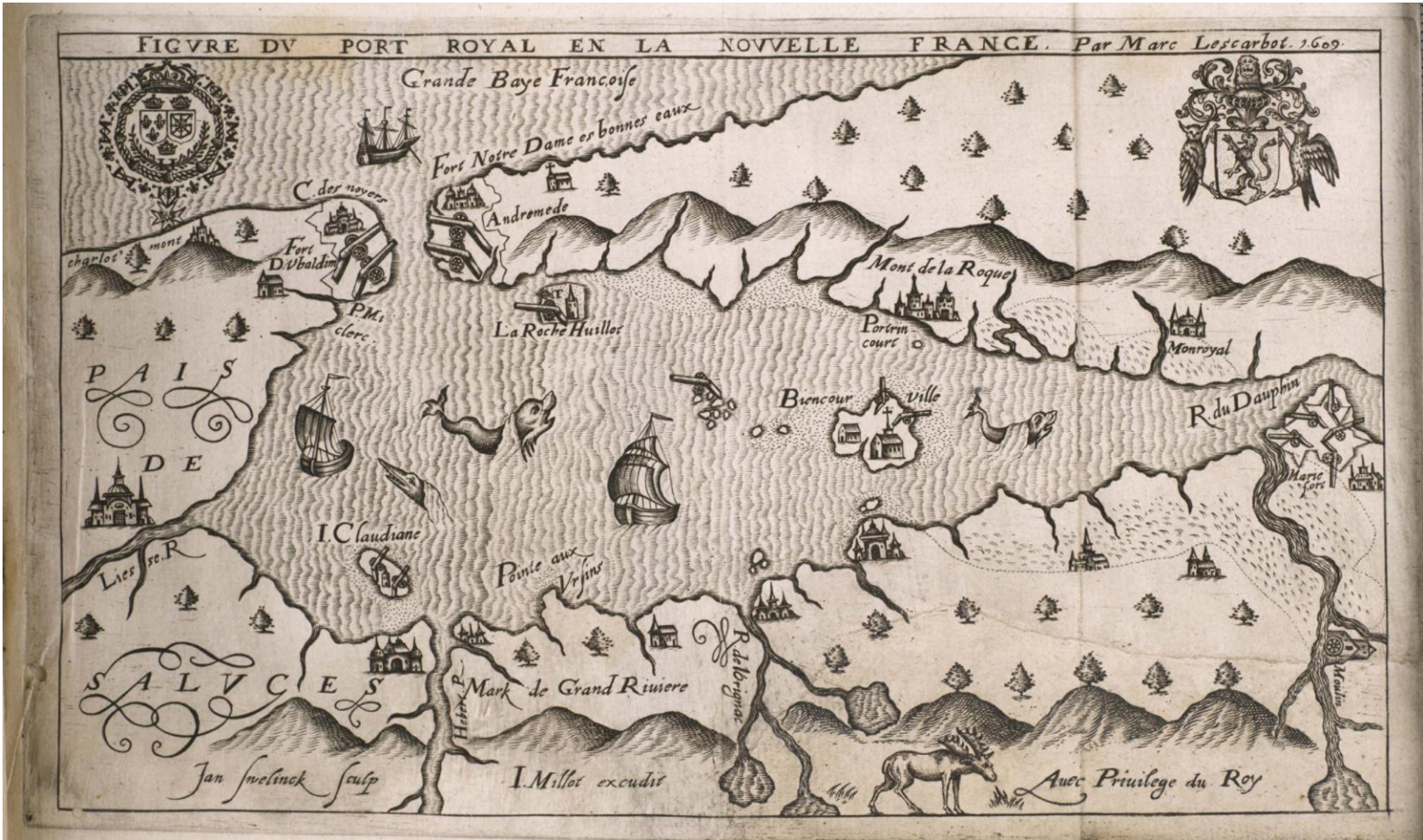
Marc Lescarbot's Maps of Acadia

Marc Lescarbot was a lawyer and author who accompanied Jean de Biencourt de Poutrincourt and Pierre du Gua de Monts to Acadia in 1606 and 1607. After his return to France, he wrote a three-volume History of New France. These books were translated into English and published by the Champlain Society, starting in 1907.¹
