**Books**

- Christian Denissen, *Genealogy of the French families of the Detroit River Region, 1701-1936* (Detroit: Detroit Society for Genealogical Research, revised edition, 1987). Although Denissen is a good starting point, it does have errors and most families are only covered through the mid-1850s. Many families who moved to Amherstburg or Tilbury are not covered. The information should be verified with parish records. Although Denissen anglicized the names, researchers should use the French forms for names in their genealogical databases. This two-volume set is available in many libraries on both sides of the Detroit River.

Lajeunesse, editor, *The Windsor Border Region* (Toronto, Ontario: The Champlain Society for the Government of Ontario, University of Toronto Press, 1960, as reprinted by the Essex County Historical Society, 1972). **Detroit Notary Records** – these records and transcriptions of records contain records from both sides of the Detroit River.

Many libraries provide access to Ancestry's databases; in most cases, access is limited to use in the library. Access is also available at Family History centers. Michigan resident may also access the Heritage Quest databases within their local library. In addition to other records, Heritage Quest contains images of all United States' Census to 1930, as well as indices for many of the censuses.

#### **Native American Records**

- Native American records are included in the records of Ste. Anne’s through about 1728 when the Huron mission was established. Records for children of French Canadians and Native Americans are contained in Ste. Anne’s records.
- After 1728, the Huron mission records are contained in Robert Toupin, *Les Écrits de Pierre Potier* (Ottawa, Ontario: Les Presses d’Université d’Ottawa, 1996). The Leddy Library at the University of Windsor owns a copy of this book.
- Starting in 1791, the records for Native Americans are contained in the records of Assumption and later in the records of St. Jean Baptiste in Amherstburg.

### **Wayne County Land Records**

- The Burton Collection at the Detroit Public Library contains 52 volumes containing digests of early Wayne County land records, marriage contracts, and other contracts.
- Silas Farmer, *History of Detroit and Wayne County and Early Michigan* (Detroit: Silas Farmer and Sons, 1890 (3<sup>rd</sup> edition), Appendix, A, French Farms or Private Claims in Wayne County, 981-986 contains summaries of the 733 Private Claims that were confirmed by the United States' Congress for land that had been granted to residents of Wayne County during the French and British regimes prior to 1 July 1796, the date that the Michigan Territory officially passed in the hands of the United States. Claimants were permitted to file claims for these lands until 1 November 1805. See page 23 for a description of the claims and the process.

### **Montréal Notary Records**

A one-volume incomplete index can be used to determine which volumes contain records concerning your French-Canadian ancestors.

### **Military Records for the War of 1812**

Gray, W. M., *Soldiers of the King the Upper Canadian Militia 1812-1815 a Reference Guide* (Erin, Ontario: The Boston Mills Press, 1995).

- This book contains information from the nominal rolls of the Upper Canada militia, although in most cases, the information is limited to the individual's name and rank. Gray also notes the names of those injured or killed in the War. Gray also provides background information regarding the role of the militia in the War of 1812. The names contained in the rolls are not as extensive as the indices for the militia records contained in Lauber's book. See below.

- Lauber's book contains an introduction and indices of the members of the militia in Essex and Kent Counties, arranged by County and Regiment. The indices list the page numbers of the Canadian Archives' microfilms that contain the nominal, muster, or payrolls for the Essex or Kent County militia. An appendix provides a descriptive inventory of the microfilms containing information for the Essex and Kent County Militia. Therefore, it is an invaluable tool if you would like to order a copy of the appropriate roll(s) containing your ancestor's name from Library and Archives Canada.

Hull surrendered the Michigan Territory to British Major General Isaac Brock, their Native American Allies, and the Militia on 16 August 1812
