

People Buried from Ste. Anne de Detroit (1766-1776): Part III¹

[Note: The following names in bold indicate that recorded proof was found that the individual was at Détroit by 1710, the founding period of the colony. Names in brackets at the end of some entries name the presiding priest and will also serve to show how long that priest was at Détroit. Names are as written in the original parish register. Additional material, in brackets, are the transcriber's comments. The dates given are burial dates. In several of the following records, the information Father Bocquet recorded is incorrect. In a few of these entries, I have noted corrections in a footnote.]

Henry Martin Chapoton, 20 days, 5 March 1766, buried in cemetery [Simple Bocquet]

Marie Louise Chauvin, daughter of deceased Jeacque Chauvin, while living, a master locksmith, and Marie Cochon du chateau, of Quebec City who lived on *rue Saint Nicolas*; widow, in a first marriage, of François Becmon [Julien Becquemont], a master tailor, of Québec; in a second marriage, wife of Nicolas Lauzon, a laborer living on his land on the *coste du Nordest*, about 77 years, 6 March 1766, buried in cemetery

A son of Simon Bergeron and Catherine Lebeau, baptized at home by the mid-wife because of danger of death, born and died 21 March 1766, 22 March 1766, buried in cemetery

Body of ... Schemitte, native of *la Loraine Allemande*, lived in province of *Marie Lande* [Maryland] *en amerique*, had come to Detroit on business and was going to return to his wife in Maryland but was prevented from doing so because of his death. The names of his parents, place of birth, and the name of his wife were unknown. About 40 years, 25 March 1766, buried in cemetery

Jeacque Moran, three days, 25 March 1766, buried in cemetery

Marie, 24 days, 31 March 1766, buried in cemetery [Possibly Marie, born 6 March 1766, of unknown parents. Her godfather was Jean Baptiste Durant who was present at her burial; her godmother, Marie Angelique Rochelot. The day after her birth, Bocquet, in concert with Legrand, Justice of the Peace at Detroit, gave Marie to *Sieur* and *Dame* Bouron to be raised, fed, brought up and instructed in all the duties of the Catholic, Apostolic and Roman religion, as their own child. Marie, in turn, would be obligated to obey, serve, and respect them, as any Christian daughter would to her parents or anyone who took their place, until the age of 20 years, following the laws and customs in the colony.]

Infant son of Alexis Campeau and Magdelaine Dumay, baptized by his grandmother, Dame Dumay, because of the danger of death, born, died and buried 6 April 1766, buried in cemetery

Charle, son of Charlotte, slave belonging to Labutte *pere*; about 15 days, 6 April 1766, buried in cemetery

Marie Joseph, slave belonging to Legrand; about 15 days, 20 May 1766, buried in cemetery

Jacques Fovel [*dit* Bigras], 17 months, 29 June 1766, buried in cemetery

Marie Louise [Beaudry] Desbuttes Saint Martin, daughter of deceased Jean Baptiste Desbuttes Saint Martin and Marie Louise Doyon; widow, in a first marriage, of Jacques Godet; wife, in a second marriage, of Joseph Dusault [Toupin *dit* Dusault], a laborer living on his land on the *coste du sud ditte des Outaouais*, about 50 years [in reality, 42 years], 19 July 1766, buried in cemetery

Louis Joseph Dusault, 18 days, 26 July 1766, buried in cemetery

Charle Chesne, about three years, 29 July 1766, buried in church

Pierre Tetar Forville, son of deceased Gabriel Tetard Forville and Marie Louise Nassé of the parish of Lachenay, diocese of *Quebek*, Government of Montreal; widower of Catherine Chesne; about 60 years, 30 August 1766, buried in church

Louise Emiler Bonvouloir, daughter of ... Emiler Bonvouloir² and Marie Daragon of the parish of Notre Dame, Montreal; widow of Jean Baptiste Goyau; 41 years, 15 September 1766, buried in cemetery

Margueritte Viot [Viau], from the parish of Longueuil, diocese of Quebec, Government of Montreal, widow of Jeacque Pilet, from the parish of Boucherville, Government of Montreal, about 60 years, 17 September 1766, buried in cemetery

An infant of Pierre Denoÿe and Marie Louise Leduc, baptized shortly after birth because of danger of death, by the midwife, Dame Prudhomme, 21 September 1766, buried in cemetery

- Marie Louise Leduc, daughter of Jean Baptiste Leduc and Angelique Decari; wife of Pierre Denoÿe, a laborer, living on his property on the *coste du sud dite des Outuaouais*, about 30 years, 26 September 1766, buried in cemetery
- Marianne Binot, family lived on the *coste du sud dite misere*, about 7 years, 6 October 1766, buried in cemetery
- Jean Baptiste Duprat, family lived on *la coulée des Renards* [Fox Creek], 9 days, 10 October 1766, buried in cemetery
- Michel Saint Cosme, 19 days, 17 October 1766, buried in cemetery
- Charlotte Gloria, from the parish of Montreal, daughter of ... Gloria and ... Gloria, wife of [not given] Dufour, about 40 years, 14 November 1766, buried in cemetery³
- Cecile Huiette [Huyet dite Champagne], [7 days], family lived on *la coulée des Renards*, 14 November 1766, buried in cemetery
- A little *panis* [male], belonging to Hé [Hay], *commissaire des sauvages*, about 10 years, 19 November 1766, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Joly dit Sans Chagrin, son of Sieur Joly, a grocer living in Paris, in l'ille de France, *rue du Four*, parish and *faubourg* of Saint Sulpice, and [left blank]. He was a soldier in the Company of Verger, a French troop of the Colony in Canada before the taking of Canada by the English; married, the name of the wife is not known; however, Simple Bocquet was told that she lived in the parish of Saint Joseph, Pointe de Levy, diocese and government of *Kebek*; 19 November 1766, buried in cemetery.⁴
- Marie Catherine Dubergé, 19 months, 7 December 1766, buried in church
- Joseph, *mitis français* and *sauvage*, about 30 years, 11 December 1766, buried in cemetery
- Francois Noel Bondy, family lived on *rue Saint Joseph*, three years minus a few days, 18 December 1766, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Reaume, son of Hiacinthe Reaume and Agathe Lacelle, lived on *rue Saint Louis*, 40 years, 18 December 1766, buried in church
- A *panis* slave, 21 December 1766, buried in cemetery
- Ignace Courville, son of François [Bailly] Courville and Marguerite Vien of the parish of Champlain, Government of Trois Rivières, bishopric of Quebec; husband of Marianne Pertuis, about 50 years, 31 December 1766, buried in cemetery
- Louis Vessier dit Laferté, family lived on *rue Saint Joseph*, 16 months, 11 January 1767, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Belleperche, son of the deceased Etienne Belleperche and Elisabeth Diette,⁵ from the city and parish of Quebec in Canada; widower of [Angélique] Steve Lajeunesse, in a first marriage; husband of Marianne Campeau, in a second marriage; about 74 years, 13 January 1767, buried in church
- Jeanne Drouillard, about two months, 17 January 1767, buried in cemetery
- Joseph Morin dit Valcour, six weeks, 30 January 1767, buried in cemetery
- Marie Louise Lafoy, daughter of the deceased Antoine Lafoy, while alive a master *perruquier baigneur*, lived in the city of *Quebek*, and Marie Morant. Deceased was the wife of *Sieur* Vessiere Laferté, a master tailor, living on *rue Saint Joseph*, about 21 years, 31 January 1767, buried in church
- Louis Cesaire Douvil Dagneau, *Equié, sieur* Dequindre, son of *Sieur* Douvil, who was an *officier* in the troops of his very Christian majesty in Canada, and of *Dame* [...].⁶ The deceased was a colonel in the militia of Detroit, lived on *rue Sainte Antoine*, and husband of the deceased Marie Anne Picotté de Belestre; about 63 years, 2 February 1767, buried in church
- Ambroise Tremblay, a laborer living at *groçe point*, son of Michel Tremblay and Genevieve Bouchard of the parish of Saint Francois Xavier *en labaye* Saint Paul, Government of *Kebek*, husband of Marguerite Simard, about 43 years, 1 March 1767, buried in cemetery
- Philippe Tourangeau, son of Jean Baptiste Guillet dit Tourangeau and Josette Pilote, 20 March 1767, buried in cemetery⁷
- Marie Victoire Binot, family lived on the *coste du sud dite Misère*, 30 March 1767, buried in cemetery
- Marie Marthe Pougé, five days, 21 April 1767, buried in cemetery

- A *Negre* belonging to LeGrand, Justice of the Peace at Detroit, about 20 years, 26 April 1767, buried in cemetery
- Jean Cecir, born at Lachine, Government of Montréal, son of Claude Cecir and Marie LaLoire; husband of Margueritte Charlotte Girard about 70 years, 23 April 1767, buried in church
- Catherine Vien, widow of Jacques Sauvage, in a first marriage; widow of Pierre Godefroy, *sieur de Vieux Point* Roctailade, in a second marriage; daughter of ... [left blank by priest]; [no day given] June 1767, buried in the church, *Chapelle de Sainte Antoine*⁸
- Julien Freton [*dit* Nantais], laborer living on his land at *Groçe pointe*, son of the deceased Pierre Freton, while living a master *tisserand drapier*, living in the parish of Saint Jean de Moidon, province and diocese of Nante en Bretagne, *française*, and the deceased Françoise Allotte. The deceased was the husband of Marie Joseph Gagnon *ditte* Duchesne. The quickness of his death combined with the distance of where he lived prevented Bocquet from giving him the last rites. Bocquet was "consoled" by the regularity of Freton's life and his assiduity at receiving the sacraments. About 40 years 4 July 1767, buried in cemetery
- Charle Dupuis *dit* Moise, son of the deceased Charle Dupuis and the deceased Therese Tremblay, from the parish of la Prairie de la Magdelaine, diocese of Quebec and Government of Montreal. Deceased husband of Catherine Casse *dite* Saint Aubin, about 35 years, 31 August 1767, buried in cemetery
- Charle LaMare, son of Jean Baptiste LaMare and Françoise Jolivet, of the parish of la Prairie de la Magdeleine, diocese of Quebec, Government of Montreal. The deceased was the husband of **Marianne Bienvenu Delille**, who was the widow of Jean Baptiste Malet, in a second marriage. About 40 years, 5 September 1767, buried in cemetery
- Izabelle Campeau, about 11 years, 11 September 1767, buried in cemetery
- Marie, daughter of a slave belonging to Bondy, one month, 23 September 1767, buried in cemetery
- Therese, daughter of a slave, named Susanne, belonging to Simon Campeau, 17 days, 27 September 1767, buried in cemetery
- Marie Josette LeBoeuf, daughter of **Pierre LeBoeuf** and [Françoise Auzou], widow of Pierre Guignan [Dignan] *dit* Saint Etienne, about 60 years, 7 November 1767, buried in cemetery⁹
- A *panis* slave (female), belonging to Cuillerie Beaubien, about 18 years, 25 October [*sic*], 1767 buried in cemetery
- Marie Françoise Paré, family lived on *la coste du Nord Est*, 27 days, [no day or month given] 1767, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Riopelle, about one month, 29 November 1767, buried in cemetery
- Angélique Campeau, daughter of Nicolas Campeau *dit* Niagara and Agathe Casse Saint Aubin; wife of Antoine Descomps Labadie [Badichon written in margin]; lived on *la coste des Poutouatamis ditte de la rivière Rouge*; 25 years and two months, 11 December 1767, buried in cemetery
- Toussaint Joseph Ducharme, 48 days, 19 December 1767, buried in cemetery
- (1) Angélique Dailleboust de la Magdelaine, wife of François Marie Ignace de Couagne; daughter of François Dailleboust de la Magdelaine and Charlotte de Godefroy Linctot de Godfroy; about 30 years, 18 January 1768, buried in church. Angélique died 29 November 1767 at *la pointe Pelée dans le lac Herié*, in a shipwreck where she was submerged. She was buried with her son, (2) Philippe François Marie de Couagne, about two years, who drowned with her. *Sieur de Couagne* declared to Bocquet that their daughter, (3) Françoise Marie Angélique de Couagne, about three years, and (4) Jacques Villeray, a native of Cedres, commander of the boat, were enveloped in the same shipwreck.
- Francois Dorval, son of [...] Dorval, master pilot living in the Lower Town of Quebec and [...] Tremblay; about 25 yars, 30 January 1768, buried in cemetery
- Gennevieve Tremblay, wife of Francois Comparé; daughter of Augustin Tremblay and Marie Judith Laforest; lived on *la Coste du Nord Est*; about 30 years, 24 February 1768, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Couture, about one month, 3 March 1768, buried in cemetery
- Louise, *panis* slave belonging to Cabassié, about 40 years, 19 March 1768, buried in cemetery
- Louise Gautier**, native of Québec, daughter of Sieur [Mathurin] Gautier, navigator, and Marie Louise [Giraud or Trolleau]; wife of the deceased **Jean Casse dit Saint Aubin**, native of Old France, but the name of the province is unknown to us [Bocquet]; about 90 years, 26 April 1768, buried in church¹⁰

- Jeaque François [Beaudry] Desbutes Saint Martin, about six months, 6 April 1768, buried in church
- Louis or Joseph Cantara, said to be from the *costes de Quebec*, arrived ill on the 8th of May from Lake Saint Clair, and died the same day, about 30 and some years, 10 May 1768, buried in cemetery¹¹
- A son of Jean Baptiste Rivard, died as soon as he was born. Because of the danger of death, baptized by the midwife, 12 May 1768, buried in cemetery
- Jeaque [Beaudry] Desbutes Saint Martin, interpreter of the Huron language for the King, a bourgeois merchant, lived on his land on the *coste du Sorouest*, husband of Marianne Navarre; son of the deceased Jaque Desbutes Saint Martin and Marie Louise Doyon; died from an apoplectic paralysis, aged about [35]¹² years, 18 June 1768, buried in church
- A young *panis* (female), belonging to Dubergé *dit* Sans Chagrin, about 12 years, 28 June 1768, buried in cemetery
- Marie Catherine Gamelin, wife of Antoine Gamelin; daughter of Laurent Eustache Gamelin and Marie Joseph Dudevour Lachine; sick for nearly one year, about 25 years, 30 June 1768, buried in church in *la chapelle de Saint Antoine*
- A young *panis* (female), belonging to Michel Hiax, about 12 years, 3 August 1768, buried in cemetery
- Marie Margueritte Tremblay, wife of Guillaume Laforest; daughter of Augustin Tremblay and Marianne Pilote of the parish of *Eboulements en l'abbaye Saint Paul*, Government of Québec; about 43 years, 15 August 1768, buried in cemetery
- François d'Assisses Reaume, about six weeks, 30 August 1768, buried in cemetery
- Michel Donelly, native of the province of *Oulster en Irlande* (no one knew the names of his parents or place of birth), about 35 years, 18 September 1768, buried in cemetery
- Suzanne Parent, about six months, 30 September 1768, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Morin *dit* Valcour, about six weeks, 23 October 1768, buried in cemetery
- Marie, *panis* slave, belonging to Cuillerier, about 20 years, 29 October 1768, buried in cemetery
- Josette Baudin *dite* Benoist, 10 days, 12 November 1768, buried in cemetery
- Joseph Fafar *dit* Macons, son of [...], no age given, 10 October 1768, buried in cemetery. [Bocquet wrote that the act had not been recorded previously due to the negligence of the parents/relatives to inform us of the origin of the deceased.]
- A *panis* slave (male) belonging to Legras, about 12 years, 3 December 1768, buried in cemetery
- A son of Alexis Campeau and Magdelaine Dumay, baptized at home by the midwife and died shortly after, 17 December 1768, buried in cemetery
- Louis or André Leclerc, son of one named Leclerc from the parish of Saint Vincent de Paul en l'île Jésus, mother's name unknown; Bocquet was assured that Louis or André was married at Montreal and lived in the *faubourg* Saint Laurent. His death was sudden, due to a fall. [Age not given], 27 January 1769, buried in cemetery
- A *panis* slave (female), belonging to Antoine Gamelin, no age given, 29 January 1769, buried in cemetery
- Marie Françoise Lozon, two days, 17 March 1769, buried in church
- Pierre [Chêne] Labutte, lived on *la coste du sud dite des Outaouais*, about 16 years, 28 February 1769, buried in church
- Marie, *panis* slave of Charle Barth, about 35 years, 10 April 1769, buried in cemetery
- A *panis* slave (female), belonging to de Chabert, about 30 years, 25 April 1769, buried in cemetery
- Charle Darvaux, native of the Government of Québec, parents' names unknown, about 25 years, 30 April 1769, buried in cemetery¹³
- Joachim Hiax, five months and a few days, 14 May 1769, buried in cemetery
- Alexis Trotier Deruisseau**, former and first church warden of this parish, former and first captain of the militia of both this city of Detroit and the adjacent coasts, also performing the functions of colonel, *bourgeois* merchant of this city, lived on *rue* Sainte Anne; son of the deceased Antoine Trotier Deruisseaux and

- deceased Marie Catherine Lefèvre, who, while alive, resided in the parish of Batiscan, then part of the parish of Champlain where the deceased was baptized, diocese of Quebec and Government of Trois Rivières; widower, in a first marriage, of **Marie Louise Roy**; husband, in a second marriage, of Catherine Godfroy *dite* Monboeuf; aged 80 years, seven months and a few days, 5 June 1769, buried in church
- Genevieve Legras, five months, 12 July 1769, buried in cemetery
- A *panis* (male), belonging to Breme, about 15 years, 5 August 1769, buried in cemetery
- A *panis* slave belong to Charle Chene, about six weeks, 5 August 1769, buried in cemetery
- Marie Jeanne Gamelin, wife of Jean Marie Legras, merchant of this city, living on *rue* Saint Joseph; daughter of Laurent Eustache Gamelin and Joseph Dudevair Lachine; about 26 years, 12 August 1769, buried in church
- Ignace Tibault, husband of Anne Jaunet; son of Louis Tibault, master carpenter living in the parish of Cap St. Ignace, bishopric and Government of Quebec, and Cécile Fournier; about 39 years, 18 August 1769, buried in cemetery
- Joseph Larivé, son of the deceased Jean Larivé, while alive, a master shoemaker residing in the *bourg* de Boucherville, diocese of Quebec, Government of Montreal, and Marianne Laforce; widower of the deceased Lalumière, both originally from Boucherville; [no age given], 27 September 1769, buried in cemetery¹⁴
- Marie Louise Dejean, 10 days, 14 October 1769, buried in church
- Pierre, *panis* slave belonging to Moran, who bought him the previous Sunday and whose sole motive was the condition of Pierre, the impossibility of his being cured of his illness, short of a miracle, and the hope for the salvation of his soul. Moran's noble and worthy conduct was that of a true Catholic. About six to seven years, 20 October 1769, buried in cemetery
- A little *mitise*, son of Antoine Chesne and a *sauvagesse*, a few days old, 8 November 1769, buried in cemetery
- Catherine Beaudin *dit* Benoist, died the day she was born (7 November 1769), 8 November 1769, buried in cemetery
- An old *panis* slave (female), belonging to Dame Cecir, 29 November 1769, buried in cemetery
- Jean Baptiste Laurent Legras, two years and eight months, 18 December 1769, buried in church
- A *panis* slave (female), belonging to Claude Campeau, about 30 years, 26 December 1769, buried in cemetery
- A son of Alexis Campeau and Magdelaine De Mai, died as soon as he was born, 4 January 1770, buried in church
- Charle, son of Jemi Halesne, soldier, and Josette Crette, born 11 January 1770, buried 12 January 1770 in cemetery
- A son of [Jean Baptiste] Duprat and Agnès Tremblay, lived at Grand Marais, born 23 January 1770, baptized by the midwife because of the danger of death, and died immediately, 24 January 1770, buried in cemetery
- Basile Denoÿe, about six weeks, 4 April 1770, buried in cemetery
- A son of Laurent Grifard and Magdelaine Casse, born 28 April 1770, baptized by the midwife because of the danger of death, died immediately, buried 29 April 1770, buried in cemetery
- Francoise Dubergé, family lived on *rue* Saint Louis, about 22 months, 2 May 1770, buried in cemetery
- Antoine Nicolas Lozon, lived on the *coste du Nord Est*, husband of Angelique Chevalier; son of Seraphin Nicolas Lozon and Marie Magdelaine Morand; about 42 years, 16 May 1770, buried in cemetery
- Margueritte, *panis* slave belonging to Cuillerie Beaubien, about 30 years, 13 June 1770, buried in cemetery
- Son of Charles Campeau and [left blank],¹⁵ born and baptized at home by Bocquet because of danger of death, died same day, 1 July 1770; [date and place of burial not specified]
- A slave (female), belonging to St. André [Landry], about two years, 9 July 1770, buried in cemetery
- Jean Baptiste LeMais, four months, 16 July 1770, buried in church
- François Dufresne *dit* Paradis, son of François Dufresne, a master mason living in the parish of Anet [*sic*], diocese of Nantes in Brittany and Françoise [...], 33 years, 28 September 1770, buried in cemetery
- Francoise Heler, family lived at *Groçe* Pointe, [no age given], 10 October 1770, buried in cemetery
- Thomas Casse, son of Noël Casse dit St Aubin and Suzanne Steve, lived on *la coste du Nord Est*, 25 years, 3 November 1770, buried in cemetery
- Josette Poupard *dite* Lafleur, about eight years, 4 November 1770, buried in cemetery

- [Ignace] Casse, about two years, 17 November 1770, buried in cemetery
- Jean Baptiste Beaudin *dit* Benoist, son of Benoist Beaudin and Marie Girard, of the parish of *Notre Dame de la Visitation en la Pointe du Lac*, diocese of Quebec, Government of Trois Rivières in Canada; lived at *Groçe Pointe*, husband of Josette Tremblay; about 30 years, 25 November 1770, buried in cemetery

- Laurent Eustache Gamelin, husband of Josette Dudevoir Lachine; son of the deceased Pierre Gamelin Chateau Vieux and the deceased Marie Jeanne Mongrais; former church warden of this parish, captain in the militia and merchant who lived on the *coste du Sorouest*, 69 years or thereabouts, 11 March 1771, buried in church
- Margueritte Simard, daughter of deceased Noël Simard and deceased Catherine Fortin of the parish of Saint Pierre in *l'abbaye Saint Paul*, bishopric and government of Quebec; widow of deceased Ambroise Tremblay; wife, in a second marriage, of Charles Morand *dit* Grimard, lived in *Groçe Pointe*, died in childbirth, about 45 years, 9 May 1771, buried in cemetery
- Jean Baptiste Duprat, family lived at Grand Marais, 4-½ years, 24 June 1771, buried in cemetery
- Daniel Jonquaire, *Equié sieur de Chabert*, lieutenant in the infantry in the service of the king of France, son of the deceased nobleman Thomas de Joncaire, lieutenant in the infantry of the detachment of the marine, interpreter, and commander for the King to the Five Nations, and Marie Magdelainne LeGay; husband of Marie Margueritte Robert [Rocbert] de la Morandiere; about 57 years, 5 July 1771, buried in church under his bench in the Chapel of the Holy Virgin
- Charle Morand *dit* Grimard, son of Charle Morand *dit* Grimard and Margueritte Simard, two months, 6 August 1771, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Doyon, master baker from the city of Quebec in Canada, husband of the deceased [record not complete], 19 August 1771, buried in cemetery¹⁶
- A son of ... Catin and ... [parents not named], born, baptized by the midwife and died immediately after on 22 August 1771, buried 23 August 1771, buried in cemetery¹⁷
- Susanne Casse, daughter of Noël Casse and Suzanne Stève; widow of Pierre Parent; wife, in a second marriage, of Amable Latour, about [left blank] years, 24 August 1771, buried in church
- Pierre Paré, 14 months, 24 August 1771, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Carbonneau *dit* Provençal, *habitant* of Terre Bonne, Government of Montreal, husband of Josette Labelle; son of Pierre Carbonneau *dit* Provençal and Marie Seguin *dite* Ladéroutte; appeared to be about 40 years, 25 August 1771, buried in cemetery
- Jeaque Dubergé *dit* Sans Chagrin, [no age given], 26 August 1771, buried in cemetery
- A little girl, daughter of Gabriel Legrand, *Equié, juge à paix*, and Veronique Reaume; born 7 September 1771, baptized at home by the midwife because of the danger she was in, died ¼ hour later, 8 September 1771, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Gosselin, 29 days, 12 September 1771, buried in cemetery
- Jeaque Philippe Labbadie, killed by a blow from the foot of a horse, about five years, 23 August 1770, buried in cemetery [It was noted by Bocquet, on page 10 in the register, that he had forgotten to write in the act and that it was on page 25.]
- Joseph Campeau, lived at Grand Marais on *la coste du Nord Est*, 22 years, 19 September 1771, buried in cemetery
- Philippe Belangé, family lived on *rue Saint Jeaque*, two months, 1 October 1771, buried in cemetery
- Pierre, *panis* slave belonging to Cuillerie Beaubien, about 30 years, 17 November 1771, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Guilbault, family lived on *rue Saint Jeaque*, about 12 years, 1 December 1771, buried in cemetery

A young *panis* (male), belonging to *Laquetoche* [Pierre] Cardinal, [no age given], 5 March 1772, buried in cemetery
Pierre Lozon, four days, 8 March 1772, buried in cemetery
Alexandre Heler, lived in *Groçe* Pointe, 3-½ months, 22 March 1772, buried in cemetery
Francoise, *panis* slave, belonging to Baby Duperon, about 40 years, 24 March 1772, buried in cemetery
A young *panis* (female), belonging to Philippe Dejean, [no age given], 28 April 1772, buried in cemetery
A young *panis* (female), belonging to *Laquetoche* Cardinal, [no age given], 29 April 1772, buried in cemetery
Angelique, *fille mitis* of Marianne, *panis* slave, belonging to *Laquetoche* Cardinal, 13 months, 12 June 1772, buried in cemetery
Pierre Monford, son of one named Monfort and of (ignorant of the name), living in the Government of Quebec in the *Seigneurie* belonging to Mr. de Saint Ours, about 35 years, 5 August 1772, buried in cemetery
Charle Chauvin, former *bourgeois* of this city and church warden of this parish; son of the deceased Jeacque Chauvin and Marie Cochon, while living, in the parish of Sainte Famille, city, bishopric, Government of Quebec; husband of **Marie Anne Casse dit Saint Aubin**; about 60 and some years, 17 August 1772, buried in church
A son of Antoine Catin and Marie Anne Martin; born, baptized at home and died ½ hour later, 17 August 1772, buried in cemetery
Antoine Guerin *dit* Dauphin, native of Saint Quentin in the province of Picardy, Kingdom of France; no information could be found concerning the names of his parents or the name of his wife; 47 years or thereabouts, 25 August 1772, buried in cemetery¹⁸
Francois, son of Charlot and Marie Louise, both slaves of Zacharie Cicotte; about one year, 26 August 1772, buried in cemetery
Louis Lemais, about five years, 28 August 1772, buried in cemetery
Charlotte, *panis* slave, belonging to Poupart Laboise, about 25 years, 19 August 1772, buried in cemetery
Marie Angelique Cicotte, family lived on *la coste du Sorouest*, seven months, 4 September 1772, buried in cemetery
Jean Baptiste Seguin *dit* Laderoute, family lived at Grand Marais, 11 months, 5 September 1772, buried in cemetery
Antoine Landry *dit* Charlot, nine months, 7 September 1772, buried in cemetery
Marie Louise Courtois, family lived on *la coste du Sorouest*, seven months, 8 September 1772, buried in cemetery
Magdelaine Raymon *dite* Toulouse, about six years, 12 September 1772, buried in cemetery
Catherine Meny, [no age given], 12 September 1772, buried in cemetery
Louis Hubardeau, husband of Monique Gro [Groulx]; son of the deceased Jean Baptiste Hubardeau, master wigmaker, while alive, living at Berthier, diocese of Quebec, and Charlotte Rouleau; 47 years, 17 September 1772, buried in cemetery
Charlotte Dehestre, family lived on the *coste du Sud*, parish of *Notre Dame du Sud*, about one year, 28 September 1772, buried in cemetery

Claude, *mitis*, son of Lisette, *panis* slave, belonging to Marsac; six months, 3 October 1772, buried in cemetery

Margueritte Ursule Elisabeth de la Morandière, daughter of Etienne Robert [Rocbert], *Equié, sieur de la Morandière*, lieutenant in the infantry, and Marie Puy Gibault [Hingue de Puységault], while alive, residing at Montréal in Canada; wife of the deceased Daniel de Jonquaire, *Equié, sieur de Chabert*, lieutenant in the infantry; about 40 years, 21 January 1773, buried in cemetery

Pierre Descomps Labbadye, born and died 12 February 1773, 13 February 1773, buried in cemetery

Joseph Ardouin, about one month, 19 March 1773, buried in cemetery

A young *panis* (female), belonging to Hay, [no age given], 20 March 1773, buried in cemetery

Jacque Campeau, about four months, 21 March 1773, buried in cemetery

A young *panise*, belonging to Tomson, about 15 years, 8 April 1773, buried in church [In the margin Bocquet wrote that the record was the baptism of Francois Marie Menard *dit* Montour.]

Joseph Couture, about one year, 21 April 1773, buried in cemetery

Firmin Landry, son of Firmin Landry and Margueritte Siouze, [age illegible], 12 June 1773, buried in cemetery

Genevieve Bernard, [no age given], 10 July 1773, buried in cemetery

Charlotte Montrais, daughter of deceased Antoine Montrais [Montreuil] and Charlotte Juillet; wife of Charle Campeau; lived on *rue Saint Joseph*; about 36 years, 24 July 1773, buried in cemetery

Louis Casse *dit* S' Aubin, killed by lightning, about 12 years, 10 May 1773, [burial location not specified]

Margueritte, *siouse de nation*, wife of Firmin Landry, died as a result of childbirth, [no age given], 24 May 1773, buried in cemetery [At this point, the pages in the register are not in order.]

Jean Marie Courtois, about one month, 1 September 1773, buried in cemetery

Genevieve Creste, 10 days, 19 September 1773, buried in cemetery

Suzanne Creste, family lived at Grand Marais, 14 days, 23 September 1773, buried in cemetery

Marie Theresse Creste, 24 days, 27 September 1773, buried in cemetery

Pierre Parent, master joiner, lived on *la coste du sorouest*, son of Pierre Parent and Catherine Sans Soucy [Langlois Sanssoucis Jacques], living in the parish of Notre Dame of the Immaculate Conception in Chambly, diocese of Quebec, Government of Montreal in Canada; about 59 years, 1 October 1773, buried in cemetery²⁰

Marthe Pougé, family lived on *rue Saint Joseph*, seven months, 1 October 1773, buried in cemetery

Marianne Navar, daughter of Robert Navar, previously a royal notary, subdelegate of *Monseigneur l'Intendant* and *Receveur des Domaines*, of his very Christian Majesty, and Marie Barois; widow of Jacque [Beaudry] Desbuttes Saint Martin, interpreter for the King of the *Uronne* [Huron] language; wife, in a second marriage, of Sieur Anthony, *docteur en medecinne*; 36 years minus 7days, 11 October 1773, buried in church *en la chapelle de Saint Antoine de Padoue*

Francois Hay, about two months, 25 October 1773, buried in cemetery

Genevieve Guibord, native of the parish of Sainte Anne, diocese of Quebec, Government of Trois Riviers, daughter of Louis Guibord and Marianne Rochelot; wife of Jean Baptiste Oelette, master joiner living on *la coste du nord Est*; [no age given], 18 October 1773, buried in cemetery

A young *panis* (female), belonging to Hay, [no age given], 11 December 1773, buried in cemetery

Angelique Bienvenûe, daughter of deceased **Francois Bienvenû dit Delille** and **Marianne LeMoine**; widow, in a first marriage, of Claude Lesprit; wife, in a second marriage, of Joseph Cabassié, former church warden of this parish, living on *la coste du sorouest*; about 52 years, 14 December 1773, buried in church

A young *panis* (male), belonging to Chapoton, about 15 years, [no day or month given] 1774, buried in cemetery

- Jean Baptiste Oelette, master joiner living on *la coste du nord Est*, near the city, and of the deceased Genevieve Guilbert, his father [and mother ?] in legitimate marriage; [no age given], 14 February 1774, buried in cemetery²³ [See Genevieve Guibord buried 18 October 1773.]
- Joseph Lesperance, [no age or information given], 28 February 1774, buried in cemetery
- Louis Campeau**, former church warden of this parish, a merchant who lived on the *coste du Nord Est*, son of the deceased **Jacque Campeau** and **Caecille Catin**; husband of **Marie Louise Robert**, widow, in a first marriage, of **Francois Peltié**; died after an illness of more than four months; 74 years, 15 March 1774, buried in church
- Felicité Chapoton, about seven years, 15 May 1774, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Chesne *dit* Labutte, former church warden, a *bourgeois* merchant of the city who lived on *rue Saint Anne*, interpreter of Indian languages for the King; died after an illness of more than a year; son of the deceased **Pierre Chesne** and the deceased Jeanne Ballin [Bailly], while alive resided in the parish of Pointe-aux-Trembles, diocese of Quebec, Government of Montreal; widower, in a first marriage, of the deceased **Magdelaine Roy**; husband, in a second marriage, of Louise Lothement Barois; about 80 years, 16 May 1774, buried in the *neffe* of the church near the *coeur*²⁴
- Hiacinthe Reaume, former church warden of this parish, a *bourgeois* merchant of the city, who lived on *rue Saint Louis*, died after an illness of nearly three years; son of deceased **Robert Reaume**, while alive, a *commerçant voyageur*, living in Montréal, diocese of Quebec, and deceased Elisabeth Brunet; husband of Agathe Laselle; 70 years, 10 June 1774, buried in church
- Marie Catherine Pitre, five months, 13 July 1774, buried in cemetery
- Francois Beneto [Bénéteau], family lived on *rue Saint Joseph*, nine months, 21 July 1774, buried in cemetery
- Angelique Gamelin, family lived on *coste du Sorouest*, five months, 5 August 1774, buried in cemetery
- Antoine Bernard, family lived on *coste du Nord Est*, about one month, 21 August 1774, buried in cemetery
- Marie Louise Tomsonne, daughter of Jean Baptiste Tomson, master barrel maker, living on *rue Saint Jacques*, and Marie Peck, [no age given], 8 November 1774, buried in cemetery
- Charles Casse, 21 years, 28 November 1774, buried in cemetery
- Charles Bouron, killed by a kick from a horse, lived on the *coste du sud*, parish of Notre Dame de l'Assomption [present-day Windsor, Ontario], 18 years, 7 January 1775, buried in cemetery

- Magdelaine Mauriceau, daughter of Antoine Mauriceau, voyageur, and Genevieve Grenon; about one year, 29 September 1775, buried in cemetery
- Marie Rose Gobeil, 11 days, 5 October 1775, buried in cemetery
- Louis Bienvenu Delille, about six weeks, 29 October 1775, buried in cemetery
- Suzanne, daughter of Jeacque Tachelo and Suzanne, both *panis* slaves, belonging to Peniche [Jean Baptiste] Campeau; about one year, 4 November 1775, buried in cemetery
- Charles Morand, lived on *la coste du Nord Est*, killed by several horrific knife blows received in treachery from one named Hecker; son of the deceased Jean Morand and Elisabeth Provençal,²⁶ bourgeois of the city of Quebec, living in the parish of la Sainte Famille de Jesus, Marie et Joseph; husband of Marie Anne Belleperche; about 50 years, 11 December 1775, buried in church
- François de Sales and his unnamed twin brother, sons of Robert Jeanne and Catherine Reaume, baptized at home, 28 January 1776, by the midwife, buried 30 January 1776, [burial location not specified]
- Pompée, Negro belonging to Antony, killed by a blow from a knife from a *sauvage de la nation sauteuse*, while defending his master from the violence of the said Indian who attacked Antony, *docteur en médecine*; about 40 years, 26 January 1776, buried in cemetery
- Jeacque Peltié, died from a false pleurisy, [parents not named], [age not given], 26 January 1776, buried in church
- Marie Joseph Menard, 6-½ months, 20 February 1776, buried in cemetery
- Jean Baptiste Pitre, family lived on *rue* Saint Jeacque, 18 days, 29 February 1776, buried in cemetery
- Gabriel Casse *dit* Saint Aubin, died from a wound received while taking care of his mill; son of **Jean Casse dit St. Aubin** and **Marie Louise Gautier**; about 60 years, 2 March 1776, buried in church
- Elisabeth Cosme, daughter of Sieur Cosme, former church warden of this parish, bourgeois merchant of the city, living on *rue* Saint Jeacque, and Catherine Lotthemement Barois; wife of Augustin Lafoy, bourgeois of the city, living on *rue* Saint Louis; [no age given], 2 March 1776, buried in church
- Marie Louise Robert**, ill for close to four years, daughter of **Pierre Robert** and **Angelique Ptolomé**; wife in a first marriage of the deceased **François Peltier Lantayac**; in a second marriage, widow, for nearly three years, of **Louis Campeau**, former church warden of this parish, merchant and *bourgeois* of this city; lived on *la coste du Nord Est*, 80 and some years, 2 April 1776, buried in church
- Rose Crete, 18 months, 17 May 1776, buried in cemetery
- Claude Thomas Gouin, former lieutenant in the French militia, royal surveyor under the French Government, had been sick for several months, a *commerçant* [merchant] who lived on his land on the *coste du Nord Est*; son of **Joseph Gouin**, a *commerçant*, living in the parish of Sainte Anne, bishopric of Quebec, Government of Trois Rivieres in Canada, and Marguerite Roy; husband of Marie Joseph Cuillerier, daughter of Antoine Cuillerier and Angelique Gerard; about 60 years, 29 May 1776, buried in church
- Joseph Quodoret [Cadoret], baptized 26 June 1776 and died shortly after the baptism, buried 27 June 1776 in cemetery
