

People Buried from Ste. Anne de Detroit (1776-1787): Part IV¹

[Note: The following names in bold indicate that recorded proof was found that the individual was at Détroit by 1710, the founding period of the colony. Names in brackets at the end of some entries name the presiding priest and will also serve to show how long that priest was at Détroit. Names are as written in the original parish register. Additional material, in brackets, is the transcriber's comments. The dates given are burial dates. In several of the following records, the information recorded by the presiding priest was incorrect. For a few of these entries, I have noted corrections and additional information in a footnote.]

Dominique Gobeil, lived on *rue* Saint Louis, three days, 31 June [*sic*] 1776, [burial location not specified]
Françoise Meloche, died from a *fièvre millière*, daughter of François Meloche, merchant and former warden of the parish, and Françoise Lozon; wife of François Bertelet [*dit* Savoyard],² *commerçant voyageur*; about 20 years, 4 July 1776, buried in church
Josette Prevost and Rosalie Prevost, a few days old, 9 August 1776, [burial location not specified]
Michel Avrar, native of la Rochelle, lived in the parish of Saint Laurent *en l'île de Montreal*; husband of Charlotte St. Onge Garaud; his illness lasted about six months; about 40 years, 16 August 1776 [1777 written at end of act], buried in church³
Brigide Petit, five months, 31 August 1776, buried in cemetery

Just before the next three entries, Father Bocquet wrote that he was including "articles" forgotten because of the quantity of sick persons and his own illness.

A young *panise*, belonging to Macomb, [no age given], 10 November 1776, buried in cemetery
Charles *Crespe* [Crête], son of Jean Baptiste Crespe, family lived at Grand Marais, about 16 years, 11 November 1776, buried in cemetery
Denis Callé, a sailor, Irish by birth, but location of birth and names of parents not known, [no age given], 11 November 1776, buried in cemetery
Pierre Boufard, son of Jean Baptiste Boufard and Josephe Boimier, [no age given], 28 November 1776, buried in cemetery
Francois, son of Lizet, *panis* slave belonging to Marsac, two days, 27 January 1777, [burial location not specified]
Jean Baptiste Casse, son of Noël Casse *dit* Saint Aubin and Susanne Steve *dit* la Jeunesse; husband of Therese Boyé; about 30 years, 27 January 1777, buried in church
Angelique Gamelin, daughter of Medard Gamelin and Angelique Cicotte; about eight months, 12 February 1777, buried in church
Pierre Beneto [Bénéteau], family lived on *rue* Saint Joseph, four days, 9 March 1777, [burial location not specified]
Genevieve Pattenotte [Patenaude], lived at *Groçe* Pointe; about four months, 8 February 1777, buried in cemetery [in margin Bocquet wrote that he had forgotten to write this act in its correct order]
Jeaque [Janson] Lapalme, son of Charle Lapalme, master blacksmith, and Marie Gendron; about one year, 11 April 1777, buried in cemetery

- Marie Angelique Cicotte, sick for more than three months; daughter of deceased Zacharie Cicotte, while living, a former church warden of the parish, officer in the militia, a *bourgeois*, merchant, lived on his land on *la coste du sorouest*, and Marie Angelique Godfroy; wife of Medard Gamelin, former church warden of the parish, merchant living on the *coste du sorouest*; 36 years, 18 April 1777, buried in church
- Nicolas Robert, son of Pierre Robert, living in the home of Sieur Godfroy as a *fermier* on the *la coste du sorouest*, and Marianne Casse Saint Aubin; about 12 years, 28 April 1777, buried in cemetery
- Theresse Cabassié, daughter of Joseph Cabassié, former church warden of the parish and *bourgeois* of the city living on the *coste du sorouest*, and Angelique Bienvenûe Delille; wife of François Gamelin, officer in the militia living on the *coste du sorouest*; died following an early and violent childbirth; [no age given], 26 May 1777, buried in church in *la chapelle de Saint Antoine de Pade*
- Marie Louise Gamelin, daughter of François Gamelin and Thérèse Cabassier, 20 days, 5 June 1777, buried in cemetery
- Marie Louise Campeau dite Cambek, baptized 27 June 1777, died shortly after the baptism, buried 28 June 1777 in cemetery
- Catherinne Belangé, family lived on *rue* Saint Joseph, baptized 27 June 1777, died shortly after the baptism, buried 28 June 1777 in cemetery
- Theresse Campeau, family lived at Grand Marais, [no age given], 6 July 1777, buried in cemetery

Father Bocquet inserted in the register the note that the following burial had been forgotten and not placed in the correct order.

- Louise Grifard, family lived at Grand Marais, *pointe des Renards*, [no age given, but was born and baptized 28 May 1777], 30 May 1777, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Reaume Themus, *entrepreneur pour les bois du Roy*; son of the deceased Pierre Reaume and the deceased Marie Steve; husband, in a first marriage, of the deceased Josephe Pilet; in a second marriage of Marie Dubois; 56 to 57 years, 8 July 1777, buried in *la grande nef* of the church
- Antoine Menard dit Montour, family lived on *la coste du surouest*, about one month, 12 July 1777, buried in cemetery

Before the following entry, Father Bocquet wrote: "We were obliged to delay the registering of the following act and of transposing it, not having been able to immediately know neither the country, nor the parents nor the true name of the deceased."

- Claude Landry dit St André, former corporal in the troops of the Marine in the service of the King of France, former church warden of the parish, lived on his land on *la coste du sorouest*; son of Claude Landry, a laborer, and Marie Marie, of the parish of Saint Pierre de Poigny, diocese of Chartres, where the deceased was born; 78 years 9 months, 16 July 1777, buried in the church in *nef de la chapelle de la Sainte Vierge*⁴
- Catherine Godfroy, daughter of deceased nobleman **Jacque Godfroy de Monboeuf**, while living, a *bourgeois* and merchant of this city who lived on *rue* Sainte Anne, and the deceased Marie Chesne; wife of the deceased **Alexis Trotier Desruisseaux**, first church warden of the parish, first captain of the militia of the post, *bourgeois* merchant of the city, lived on *rue* Sainte Anne; about 60 years, 21 July 1777, buried in *la nef* of the church
- Marie Catherine Bernard dit Fontaine,⁵ 13 days, 4 August 1777, buried in cemetery
- A Negro named Louis, belonged to Bufet, [no age given], 13 August 1777, buried in cemetery
- Nicolas Gatignon, 13 days, 13 August 1777, [burial location not specified]

- Marie Louise Reaume, family lived on *la coste du Nord Est*, two months, 17 August 1777, buried in cemetery
- A *panis* (female), belonging to Bertelet Savoyard, about 30 years, 18 August 1777, [burial location not specified]
- A son of Pierre Drouillard, interpreter of several native languages for the king, and Angelique Descomps Labbadie; born 17 August 1777, baptized immediately at home by Claude Campeau because of danger of death, died soon after; buried 18 August 1777 in cemetery
- Simon Navar [Navard in margin], son of Robiche Navar and Archange de Marsac, born and baptized day before [no date given – act between dates of 18 August 1777 and 25 August 1777], died shortly after, buried [no date given] 1777 in cemetery
- A son of Claude Gatignon Duchesne and Archange Patoka [Marie Jeanne Billioud *dite* Lespérance *dite* Patoka], baptized by the midwife because of danger of death, died shortly after, 25 August 1777, buried in cemetery
- Amable Meny, 17 days, 27 August 1777, buried in cemetery
- Pierre Macé, a day laborer, son of deceased Pierre Macé, while living, a captain of the *gaulette*, and Jeanne Bourbon [*sic*], lived in *la vieille charrette*, parish of Charlesbourg, near Quebec; [no age given], 5 September 1777, buried in cemetery, in the presence of [...] Lorain, his first cousin⁶
- Jacque Rivard, family lived on *la coste du Nord Est*, four months and 20 days, 21 September 1777, buried in cemetery
- Marie Robert Jeanne, died from a completely unknown illness; wife of Antoine Saint Aubin, a laborer living on the *coste du sud*, parish of Notre Dame de l'Assomption [present-day Windsor, Ontario]; daughter of Robert Jeanne and Marie Catherine Reaume; [no age given], 30 September 1777, buried in cemetery
- Charle Poupert Lafleur, master wheelwright and *bourgeois* of the city; son of deceased Charle Poupert dit Lafleur and the deceased Agnès Braze [Brazeau]; married Babet [Élisabeth/Isabelle] Saint Aubin; [no age given], 1 October 1777, buried in cemetery
- Joseph Francois Fontenay dit L'Espagnol, two years, two months and 13 days, 12 October 1777, buried in cemetery
- Francois de Marsac, *Equier*, son of **Francois, Equié sieur de Marsac Lhomme trou**, and Therese Campeau; husband of Charlotte Bourassa; former church warden of this parish; lived at Grand Marais; [41] years, 19 October 1777, buried in church in *chapelle de la Vierge, proche du banc de Coeur*[?]
- Francois Fontenay, 11 October 1777. [Father Bocquet indicated he had forgotten to write the act on the preceding page; gave no other details.]
- Isabelle Alexandre Legrand. Father Bocquet stated that she was the daughter of Alexandre Legrand [actually Commodore Alexander Grant], commander of his majesty's ships on the lakes of this province, and Therese Barth; one month, 20 October 1777, buried in church.
- Therese Casse dite Saint Aubin, [no age given], 20 October 1777, buried in cemetery
- Marie Joseph Paillé [Payet], [no age given], 3 November 1777, buried in church
- Jean Baptiste Duprat, family lived at Grand Marais, 18 days, 7 November 1777, buried in cemetery
- Francois Fontenay dit l'Espagnol, about three years, 12 October 1777, buried in cemetery [note in margin from Father Bocquet that he had forgotten to record this act]
- Marie Françoise Descomps Labbadye, 13 months, [no day given] 1777, buried in church
- Jacque Duberge dit Sans Chagrin, family lived on *rue* Saint Louis, about one month, 10 November 1777, buried in cemetery

⁶ Pierre Jean Masse, son of Pierre Marie Masse and Marie Jean Pinguet Beaucour, was born and baptized, 10 January 1749, at Québec. His father was a ship's captain [*capitaine de navire*]. His two brothers, Charles Laurent and François Xavier, were buried at l'Ancienne-Lorette [PRDH #25296]. Transcriber's note: At this time I cannot see a connection between Pierre *Macé* and a Lorain.

- Jean Baptiste Ademard St. Martin, family lived on *rue* Sainte Anne, 13 months, 13 November 1777, buried in church
- François de Marsac, Equie, sieur de L'homme trou**, husband of the deceased Theresse Campeau; son of the deceased **Francois** [Jacob] **de Marsac, Equie, sieur de L'homme trou** and deceased **Therese David**; [no age given], 17 November 1777, buried in church
- Therese Gamelin, about three years, 18 November 1777, buried in cemetery
- Therese, daughter of [left blank], *mitif* slave, belonging to Jean Baptiste [*Peniche* written in margin] Campeau; two months, 20 November 1777, buried in cemetery
- Marion, daughter of Lio... and Jaime [*sic*], Negroes belonging to Saint Bernard; about two months, 24 November 1777, buried in cemetery
- Rose Seguin dite Laderoutte, lived at Grand Marais, sick for nearly six months, [no age given], 2 December 1777, buried in church
- Simon Tremblay, two months, 23 December 1777, buried in cemetery
- The body of a Huron (male), [no age given], [no day or month given] 1777 [date of preceding act was 28 December 1777 but no date, except year given for next act –see below], buried in cemetery
- Pierre, *huron de nation*, [no age given], [no day or month given – next act in the register is dated 12 January] 1778, buried in cemetery
- Leopol Chesne dit Meny, interpreter of native languages for the King at this post and the environs, captain of the other interpreters employed by the King in this city; son of deceased Pierre [Charles] Chesne, interpreter of native languages for the King, *bourgeois* of this city, and Caterinne Sauvage; [no age given], 13 January 1778, buried in church
- Marie, young *mitif* slave, belonging to the widow Cicotte, about three years, [no day or month given] 1778, buried in cemetery
- Infant son of Valade dit Lajeunesse [Joseph Amable Valade *dit* Lajeunesse], day laborer, and Marie Theresse Binot; born 8 February, baptized by the midwife because of the danger he was in, died shortly after, buried 9 February 1778 in cemetery
- Charle Denis Laurin, family lived on *rue* Saint Joseph, six months, 9 February 1778, buried in cemetery
- Joseph [Beaudry] Debutte Saint Martin, interpreter of the Huron language for the King; son of the deceased Jean Baptiste Debutte Saint Martin and Marie Louise Doyon; husband of Magdelaine Payé; 49 years, 12 February 1778, buried in cemetery
- A little child [*sauvage* written in margin], baptized by Monsieur Marsac Portail, [no information about the parents], 19 February 1778, buried in cemetery
- Francois Capelet, died from *une saignée faite mal* [a blood letting done wrong]. Nothing is known concerning his parents or his place of birth, 8 March 1778, buried in cemetery
- A young *panis* (male), belonging to Ademard, about one year, 13 March 1778, buried in cemetery
- Guillaume Hay, about one month, 22 March 1778, buried in church
- Therese Dubé, family lived at Grand Marais, 2-½ years, 5 April 1778, buried in cemetery
- Joseph Bourdeau *dit* Lilleronde, 38 days, 16 May 1778, buried in cemetery
- Elisabeth Catin, family lived on *la coste du surouest*, 18 days, 19 May 1778, buried in cemetery
- Jeanne Duguée [Duguay], daughter of the deceased Jeacque Duguée, while living, a surgeon of the hospital and garrison of the city of Trois Rivieres in Canada, and the deceased Jeanne Bouche⁷ [*sic*]; widow of sieur **[Jacques] Cardinal**, while living, a *bourgeois* and merchant of this city; lived on the *coste du Nord Est*; 85 years, 10 June 1778, buried in church
- Josette Robert, family lived on *la coste du surouest* [no age given], 2 July 1778, buried in cemetery
- Agatte Laselle, daughter of Jeacque Lacelle, master joiner from the parish of Notre Dame in the city of Montreal, and of Agatte [Angélique] Gibault; widow of Hiacinte Reyaume, a former church warden of this parish, a *bourgeois commerçant* of this city, lived on the *rue* Saint Louis; [no age given], 19 July 1778, buried in church

- Marie Genevieve Renau [Renauld in margin], six months, 28 July 1778, buried in cemetery
- Marie Catherine Belangé, 14 months, 17 August 1778, buried in cemetery
- Brigide Petit, family lived at Grand Marais, about two years, 11 September 1778, buried in cemetery
- Marie Louise Doyon, widow of Jean Baptiste Doyon [*sic*], who lived on his land located on the *coste du sorouest*; 75 years, 15 September 1778, buried in church in the *chapelle de Saint Antoine*⁸ [In the margin Father Bocquet wrote that the act was the burial of Marie Louise Desbuttes St. Martin]
- Jean Baptiste Peltié, husband of [Catherine] Vallé dit Versaille; son of Jean Baptiste Peltié, *laboureur*, who lived on his land located on the *coste du Nord Est*, and Joseph[e] Cornet; [no age given], 24 September 1778, buried in cemetery
- Raymon, 5 October 1778, buried in cemetery [The name Raymon is in the margin; only the date and place of burial were given in the act.]
- Medard Gamelin, first lieutenant and *aide major de la compagnie des volontaires*; ill for 17 days; widower of Angelique Cicotte; 34 years, 11 October 1778, buried in church
- Catherine *veuve* Chesne, daughter of the deceased [Jacques] Sauvage and the deceased Catherine Vien; after an illness of close to six months; 83 years, 1778 [no day or month given – between an act for 21 October and 22 October 1778], buried in church⁹
- Joseph Maillou, *laboureur*, lived on his land located on the *coste du sud*, parish of Notre Dame de l'Assomption; church warden of the said parish; died in the parish of Ste. Anne de Detroit where he had come to be taken care of and cured; son of the deceased Pierre Maillou who had been a judge and captain of the seignory and parish of Saint Charles de Beauport, diocese and government of Quebec, and the deceased Louise Vacher [*sic*]; [no age given], 10 December 1778, buried in church¹⁰
- Filis Metay, son of [left blank] Metay, *maitre meunier* [master miller] living at Boucherville and [left blank], about 40 years, 19 January 1779, buried in cemetery¹¹
- Nicolas Laselle, after a long illness of about six months; son of Jeacque Laselle, master joiner and *bourgeois* of the city of Montreal, parish of Notre Dame, and Agatte [Angélique] Gibault; widower of Josette Cardinal dit Questio; 62 years, 28 April 1779, buried in church

There are seven acts that have only the names of the baptized or deceased given. The last date written is 11 May 1778 [1779?]; the next date written is 20 May 1779. [An asterisk is in front of each entry for which only the name was written.]

*Catherine Vien, wife of Jacque Casse dit St. Aubin [no further information is given]¹²

- *Bapt de Catherine, daughter of Josette, slave belonging to Alexis Delille [J. Bte Compeau *fiils* signed the act, even though no other information was given.]
*Baptême de Josette Bourdeau dit Lille Ronde
*Bapt de Jean Bapt Robert
*Bapt de Doroté *panise* slave of Macomb [Adhemar St. Martin signed the act, even though no other information was given.]
*Antoine de Pade Bourdeau dit Lilleronde [no further information is written] This notation was immediately followed by the next recorded act.
Antoine de Pade Bourdeau dit Lilleronde, two days, 20 May 1779, buried in cemetery
*Bapt de Charle Latour
[left blank] Tremblay, [no age given], 15 June 1779, buried in cemetery
Suzanne [Landroche] Scayanis, family lived at *moulin du Grand Marais*; seven months, 1779 [no day or month given – succeeding act is dated 22 June 1779], buried in cemetery
Antoine Peltié [act left blank – between acts dated 23 July 1779 and 3 September 1779]
Raymon Lenfan [act left blank – between acts dated 9 November 1779 and undated burial act of Joseph Chalou]
Joseph Chalou [act left blank – between burial record of Raymon Lenfan and act dated 1 February 1779 (*sic*)]
François Bertelet dit Savoyard, *commerçant*, lived on *coste du sud* of this parish, and of Anne Boulard who lived in parish of Lachine, Government of Montreal *en Canada*; husband of [left blank] Godet Marantay; [no age given], 1 February 1779 [*sic*], buried in church in *la chapelle de la Sainte Vierge*¹³
Jean Baptiste Rho [Rau], widower of Marie Jeanne Prudhomme; native of the parish of [illegible], diocese of Quebec, government of Trois Rivieres; about 58 – 59 years, 4 December 1779, buried in cemetery¹⁴
Nicolas Lozon *pere* [act left blank – between acts dated 10 December 1779, baptism of Louis Morin (no date or information given), and 10 January 1780, marriage of Louis Baptiste Cousinot and Marie Françoise Davignon]¹⁵

A *panis* belonging to Meniche Labbady, about 14 years, 13 May 1780, [place of burial not specified]
Charle Riviere, *commerçant voyageur dans les pays d'en haut*; son of [left blank] Lariviere; originally from Montreal; husband of Margueritte Carignan who lived in the parish of Boucherville, Government of Montreal; about 60 years, 12 May 1780, buried in cemetery¹⁶

Judith Latour, about three months, 25 June 1780, buried in cemetery
Caecille Drouillard, four days, [born 14 June] 1780, buried in cemetery
Marie, *fille batarde de la veuve Marsac*, [no age given], 4 July 1780, buried in cemetery
Francois Duchesne, lived at Grosse Pointe of this parish; native of Montreal; 104 years and a few days, 20 July 1780, buried in cemetery¹⁷
Burial of a little child found [act left blank]
Burial of Deschêne [act left blank]
